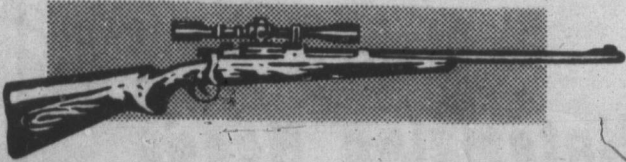

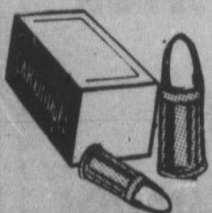

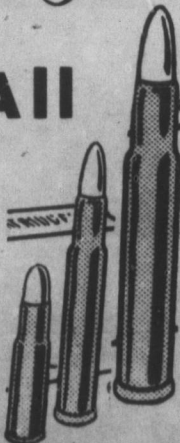

WHERE DID YOUR MONEY GO? by Andrew Tully and Milton Britten is an honest—and disturbing—appraisal of our foreign aid program.

A PRIMER OF GOVERNMENT SPENDING by Robert Heilbroner and Peter L. Bernstein explains the central economic issue of the 1960s—government spending—in simple and vivid terms.

A PARENT'S GUIDE TO THE NEW MATHEMATICS. Evelyn Sharp explains the mysteries of the new (or modern) mathematics now being introduced to American children at all levels in the schools.

SONG AND GARDEN BIRDS OF NORTH AMERICA and WATER, PREY AND GAME BIRDS OF NORTH AMERICA. Two magnificent National Geographic Society volumes profusely introduced in full color. Each volume has a series of recordings of dozens of bird calls you may play on your own phonograph.

PLANT DRUGS THAT CHANGED THE WORLD by Norman Taylor is the story of the origin and use of drugs of world-wide acceptance—all derived from plants. In non-technical terms he tells where the plants were found, who first used them and why, and how they ultimately became life-saving or painkilling drugs.

ALBERT SCHWEITZER'S GIFT OF FRIENDSHIP is the heart-warming story of an extended friendship with Schweitzer and his staff as told in the first person by the noted photographer Eric Anderson.

GIVE MY HEART by Marion Robinson is the warm, personal biography of Dr. Marion Hilliard, a dedicated woman doctor, loved and admired by her patients and the thousands of readers of her "A Woman Doctor Looks at Love and Life."

WHY SPACE? and How it Serves You in Daily Life by Martin Caidin is the first comprehensive picture of how we're already utilizing and exploiting space in many ways that are changing our life right here on earth.

IN THE MIDST OF PLENTY: The Poor of America, by Ben H. Bagdikian, describes the plight of America's poor, some with skills, some without, many with families and all with hopes,

prayers and aspirations, living without enough in the midst of plenty.

BLACK BEECH AND HONEYDEW. Ngalo Marsh, the popular New Zealand author of numerous suspense stories, has taken time out from writing about false clues and fatal moves to give her readers this delightful and very welcome autobiography.

THE SOUTHERN MYSTIQUE by Howard Zinn. How reluctant white Southerners have exposed the fallacy of gradualism, and how reluctant white Northerners have shown that Southern racism may be an exaggerated version of national prejudice.

THE HOLY MERRIMENT. Contemporary Poetry Series,

University of N. C. Press, Chapel Hill. In the "honest incarnations" in this volume Arnold Kenseth, a Congregationalist minister, expresses the holy merriment he finds in the love of God, man and the whole of the invisible world.

YES I CAN. The story of Sammy Davis Jr., by himself and Jane and Burt Boyar. Self-portrait of one of the extraordinary men of our time, who became a figure of controversy because he has dated to live his life not as a Negro but as a man.

TO BUILD A SHIP. This novel by Don Berry tells the story of a handful of young men who took up land on beautiful Tillamook Bay in Oregon in the 1850s—defiant dreamers battling the wilderness.

BRIDGEPORT BUS by Maureen Howard. Mary Agnes Keely, a spinster of large insight and small experience, leaves the tired Connecticut factory town where she has lived for so many years and presents herself open and willing to the beauty and terror of New York.

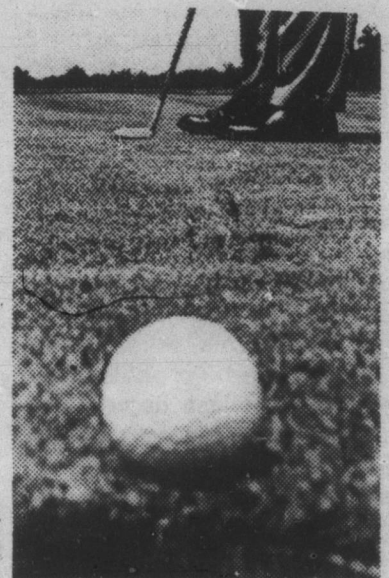
