The workshop is free and is open to all Brownies and Girl Scouts in Yancey and adjoining counties. Everyone is requested to bring a bag lunch.

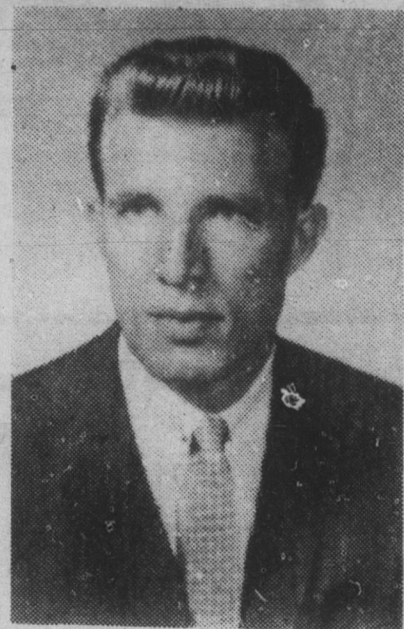
Miss Helen Silver, Charles McCurry Wed
