## SOCIAL SECURITY

In the last article before this I explained why, under the new law, all people 65 or over who are employed or self-employed, and have not applied for Social Security because they have thought they are earning too much to get monthly benefits, should file applications now.

In brief — whether they are retired or not, and even though they may still be working full time, under the new law these 65-year old and older people should file applications without delay. These applications are necessary and will (1) qualify them for the "Medicare" protection, and (2) ensure that they will get any monthly benefits they may be entitled to under the more

liberal earnings provision now in the law.

Another large group of people must also contact us to file applications for the new Medicare (hospital and medical insurance) protection under Social Security. These are the men and women 65 and over who have never worked under Social Security, or never worked long enough to get monthly benefits. They are eligible for both the basic hospital insurance and the supplementary medical insurance. But they must apply for it.

All these aged people should file their applications for this protection — without delay.
