

MEN'S CLUB HEARS PROGRAM ON FIRE DEPARTMENT

Burnsville Men's Club held its regular meeting at the Community Building Monday night with the program being presented by Burnsville Fire Department.

Fire Chief Robert Hilliard led a panel discussion on the history and operation of the Burnsville department. Other members of the panel included Paul Biggerstaff, Kenneth Robertson, and Harold Butner.

Rev. Woodward Finley reported that a balance of \$600.00 was still outstanding on lights installed on the Burnsville Elementary School ball field last summer. Members of the club assumed the project of lighting the field for the softball games played at night. Due to well lighted fields in the county, approximately thirty softball clubs were formed.

Proffitt Cites Gains Of Policy Holders

Ninety-one per cent of the \$753 million estimated net gain from Mutual Of New York's 1965 operations will be returned to policyholders as dividends or extra interest.

Mr. Ralph T. Proffitt, MONY field underwriter in Burnsville, reported today that the company will set aside \$687 million from 1965 earnings for dividends or as extra interest above the amount guaranteed in settlement options. This compares with \$611 million in 1964.

Subject to ratification by the board of trustees after the close of 1965, payments next year to North Carolina residents who own individual life insurance policies with MONY will average about 10% greater than if the present dividend scale had been continued.

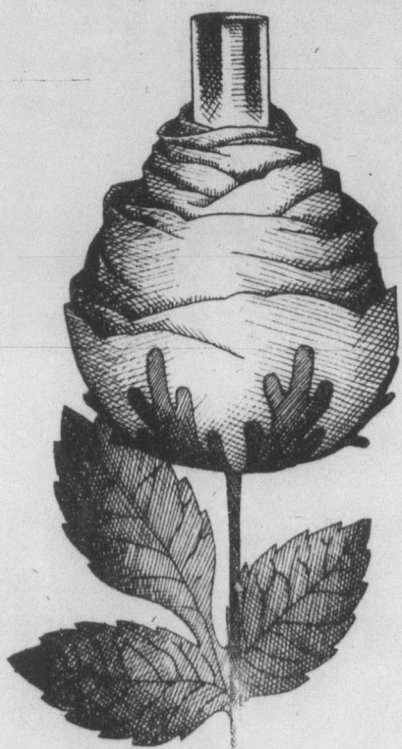
