

Tax Short Course To Be Held Across State

North Carolina State University's Farm and Small Business Income Tax Short Courses will be held in four locations across the state, beginning in late November, according to E. L. Dillingham County Extension Chairman.

The two-day course, especially designed for accountants who figure other persons' returns, will be held in Asheville, November 29-30; Charlotte, December 1-2; Greensboro, December 2-3; and Greenville, December 6-7.

The course content will be the same in each location with each program offering a complete run-down on the new features of both the State and Federal Revenue Laws.

Cooperating in the presentation of these programs are the United States Internal Revenue Service, the North Carolina Department of Revenue, the North Carolina Society of Accountants and the Social Security Administration.

The courses are conducted as a cooperative venture of the Division of Continuing Education and the Department of Economics at North Carolina State University.

Among the topics which will be discussed by the accountants attending the program will be farm income, self employment income, business income and expenses, capital gains and losses, travel expenses and exemptions, state income tax laws, Social Security regulations, itemized deductions and a close look at the many changes made in the Federal Revenue Act of 1964.

An advanced course, for those persons wishing additional instruction in this particular field, is slated for the North Carolina State University campus on December 8-10.

This advanced course is recommended for only those persons who have considerable knowledge and experience in the field of income tax filing and returns.

The registration for each of the four regular courses is \$750 a person. Additional information can be obtained by contacting the Division of Continuing Education, North Carolina State University, Raleigh, North Carolina.

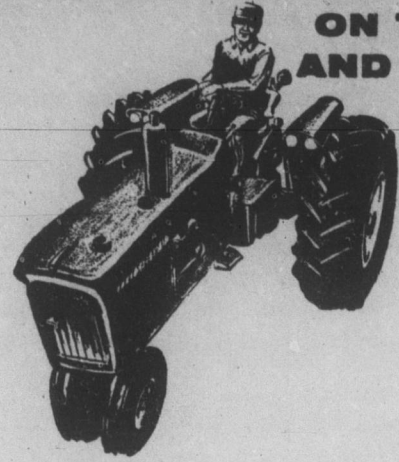

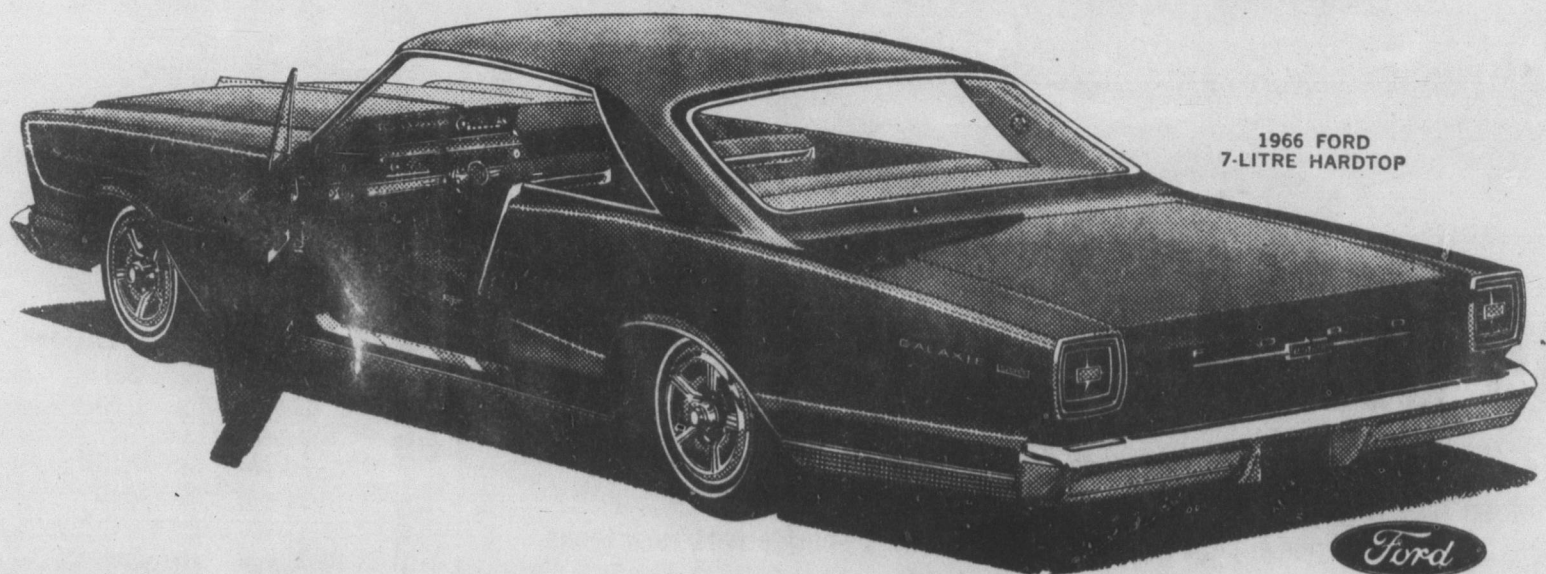
