Miss Sara Hensley, discussed new concepts of creativity in education from the standpoint of the textbook, the teacher, and the pupil.

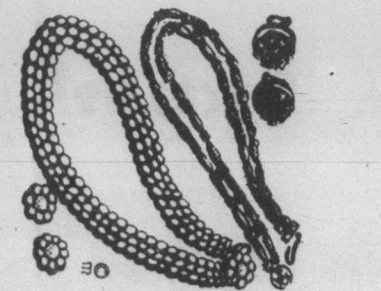
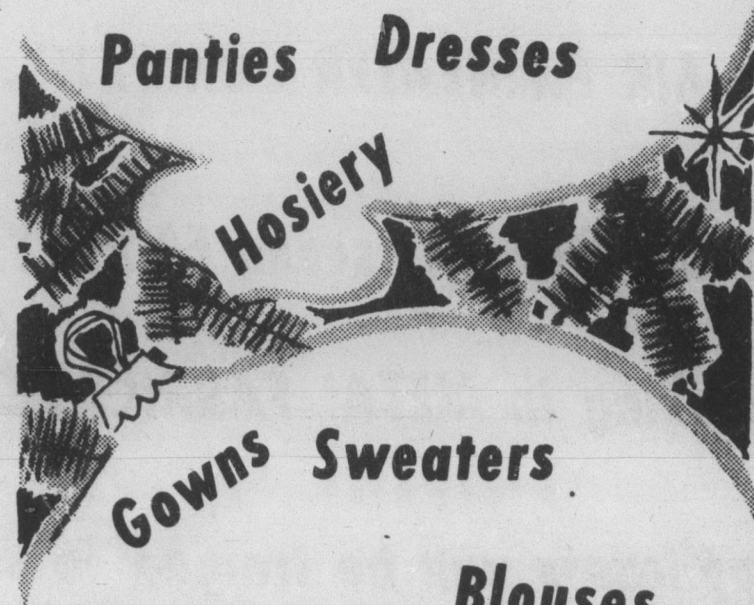
