## DEYTON NAMED TO BOARD OF N.C. AGRI. FOUNDATION

At the annual meeting held in Raleigh on November 23rd, O. W. Deyton was elected to serve a four year term on the Board of Directors of the North Carolina Agricultural Foundation, and also a four-year term on the Executive Committee.

The Agricultural Foundation program was started in North Carolina to support a broad program of research, teaching, and extension activities in the School of Agriculture and Life Science at North Carolina State University.

He received his BS Degree in Agriculture from Berea College, Berea, Ky., in 1939. Following graduation he did graduate work for two years at N. C. State University, majoring in Animal Husbandry.

Mr. Deyton has worked with the N. C. Extension Service in Wilson and Mitchell Counties, and was Assistant Supervisor of Farmers Home Administration in Yancey County. For the past fifteen years he has been in the Farm Supply business in Burnsville.
