as well, particularly for outer wear. The Yarn Division is a leading supplier of textured filament and spun sales yarn to the knitting and weaving industries. Famous products include "Bucarone" and "Buca'ini" — boucle yarn used in higher styled sweaters, knitted shirts, blouses, dresses and swimwear.

When Glen Raven begun operations in Yancey County, it had only 224 looms in place. One hundred of these were made in 1933 and were well on their way to being obsolete at the time of their installation. Since 1955, 124 of the original looms have been replaced and others added so that now there are over 540 modern looms in operation.

Just as each year has seen improvement in methods and machinery, other things have improved as well. In the past five years, wages have increased 22%, and another wage increase is in the offing. Floor space had been increased almost 50%, and the old building has been modernized.

Mr. Allen E. Gant, president of the firm, is one of its founders. Through the vision of men such as he and his brother, the late Mr. Roger Gant, Sr., Glen Raven got an early start in man-made fibers. Through their foresight, the company grew to its present position in the market place.

Glen Raven has a story to tell, and it hopes to use this occasion to do so. As a small cog in the wheel of the American free enterprise system, located in Yancey County, but serving the nation, this mill is using this means to inform its friends and neighbors of its part and Yancey County's part in a growing dynamic industry.
