

Small Business Development Announces Loans Available

Miss Ruth Johnson, recently appointed as Executive Secretary of the Small Business Development Center for the W.A.M.Y. area, announces that money is still available for loans.

These loans are meant to help start new businesses or to expand a ready established small businesses. Sums ranging from \$2,500 to \$15,000 are available.

There are less stringent collateral requirements for these Small Business Administration (SBA) loans than for normal commercial loans. It fact, the applicant must show proof that a commercial money-lending establishment has rejected his loan application before the loan will be made by S.B.A.

Other requirements include character references for the applicant, proof of

the local's need for the business, and the applicant must not have earned over the previous twelve-month period more than the amounts indicated on the following income scale.

Family Size, Income: 1 \$4,040; 2 \$4,490; 3 \$4,940; 4 \$5,630; 5 \$6,185; 6 \$6,635; 7 or more \$7,790.

Physical Education Building To Be Dedicated At A.S.T.C.

BOONE, N. C.—Memories of two former coaches and athletic stars at Appalachian State Teachers College will be honored on Sunday, August 7, when the college's present Health, Physical Education and Recreation building is named and dedicated.

To be known as Broome-Kirk Gymnasium, the building will be named and dedicated for Robert W. Broome and John Z. Kirk, Jr.

Both men died while serving as coaches at the college and both were outstanding football players as undergraduates at Appalachian.

Dr. W. Amos Abrams, assistant executive secretary of the North Carolina Education Association and editor of the publication North Carolina Education, will be the speaker for dedicatory ser-

VICES scheduled for 2:30 p. m. Dr. Abrams is a former chairman of the Department of English at the college.

Dr. W. H. Pemmons, president of the college, has announced that all athletes who played on teams with either Broome or Kirk or who played under them when they later returned as coaches have been invited to attend the ceremonies as special guests. Contemporary coaches at other Carolinas Conference colleges and other schools also have been invited.

Broome died June 20, 1959 from the effects of a bone marrow ailment while serving as head football coach.

Kirk and his six-year-old son Steve were drowned in a boating accident at Watauga Lake on May 23, 1961. The two had gone fishing.

Broome was a native of Greenville, S. C., while Kirk was a native of Lexington.
