Mrs. Taylor Elected Club President

Washington, D. C. — Mr. Roy A. Taylor of Washington and Black Mountain, N. C., wife of the Congressman from the 11th District of North Carolina, today was elected president of the histor c Congressional Club of Washington.

Mrs. Taylor, a native of Leicester, N. C., succeeds Mrs. John C. Kunkel of Harrisburg, Pa.

Elected for a two-year term, Mrs. Taylor becomes the 32nd president of the 59year-old club, located for more than 50 years in 113present home at 2001 New Hampshire Ave.

She also is the first North Carolinian to serve as its president, although a former resident of her home county of BuncOmbe, the late Mrs. Peter Goelet Gerry of Rhode Island, served as its president in 1927-28 when her husband was a member of the Senate. Mrs. Gerry, widow of George W. Vanderbuilt, had formerly resided in Asheville, N. C., in the famed Biltmore House built by Vanedrbilt in the 1890's.

Membership in the club, which is the only club to be chartered by an Act of Congress, includes wives of members of both houses of Congress, women members of Congress, wives of members of the Supreme Court and the Cabinet, and associate membership includes their daughters and daughters-inlaw. Honorary membership is conferred upon wives of the President, the Vice President and the Speaker of the House, or their official hostesses.

As president, Mrs. Taylor will preside over the annual First Lady's Breakfast, traditionally the most colorful and festive event held by the club. Last year around 1,000 women from throughout the nation gathered in the Shoreham Hotel to honor the First Lady.

The presidency of the club, which has a current membership of around 550, alternates between Renublicans and Democrats, with the president's nine member board including five from her own party and four from the other party.

The colorful history of the club began in 1906 with a suggestion at a capital dinner party that congressional women should have a club of their own. The club held its first formal meeting in 1908 at 1432 K. Street, and

President and Mrs. Will'am-Howard Taft were honored at a formal reception at the club in the same year.

The present clubhouse, built after the land and \$30,000 for construction and furnishings were donated by Mrs. John B. Henderson, wife of the Senator from Missouri, was dedicated in 1914 with a formal reception at which President Woodrow Wilson was guest of honor.

Open from January to June, the club has been self-supporting since it was founded, obtaining funds parily through an annual bazaar but largely through the sale of a Congressional Cookbook featuring recipes from members and wives of ambassadors to the United States. The cokbooks, which are not placed on public sale, can be bought from the club and are purchased by many members as gifts for brides.


