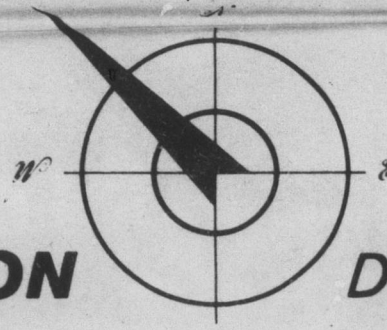
Newdale Club Meets
