## W.A.M.Y. Board Of Directors Meet

SPRUCE PINE — A full though informal partnership between W. A. M. Y. COMMUNITY ACTION, Inc. and the North Carolina Fund was agreed upon by W.A.M.Y.'s Board of Directors here January 23.

The directors voted unanimously to ask the Fund for close support in the next 18 months and take full advantage of all assistance the Fund can give the local community action program.

The North Carolina Fund was set up to run for five years, and is now in the last eighteen months of its existence. The agreement does not mean, however, that the North Carolina Fund will gain any control over the W.A.M.Y. organization, but simply that the two agencies will cooperate whenever possible.

The Fund now supplies about \$4,000 to W.A.M.Y. each year to pay administrative costs, and also supports other programs, including the Incentive grants project that gives money to small communities for local improvement projects.

About 25 board members attended the public session. Spectators and W. A. M. Y. staff members brought the audience to about 100.

Dr. W. H. Plemmons, president of Appalachian State Teachers College, was re-elected president of the Board. Dr. Lawson Tate was re-elected vice-president, Harry McGhee was named secretary, and J. B. Robinson will hold the treasurer position.

Mrs. Beatrice Young, Mr. Hubert Justice Mayo, Robert Helmle, and Rev. Woodward Finley were named to represent Yancey County on the board's executive committee.

W.A.M.Y. received a clean bill of financial health in a recent audit of its books, Business Manager Bill Stout told the group. The audit covered a year period from September of 1965 to September of 1966.
