Scout Council To Organize Two New Districts

Due to the addition of a new professional staff member and the subsequent realignment of several service areas, two new administrative districts of the Daniel Boone Boy Scout Council are in the process of being organized. Both will be served by district Scout executive Frank Gay.

The new district will be composed of all the Scouting units in Madison and Yancey Counties. Madison was formerly a part of the French Broad district and Yancey of the Mayland district. An organizational meeting has been set for Monday night, February 6, in Room 32 of the Administration building at Mars Hill College. The heads of all institutions which sponsor one or more Scouting units, their institutional representatives, and several key Scouters from both counties will meet and begin the formation of the new district. Ultimately a new rame will be chosen, a district committee elected, a commissioner's staff appointed and a district calendar developed.

Currently there are seven Cub Scout units and fifteen Boy Scout Troops registered in Madison and Yancey counties, with a total membership of seventy-two Cub Scouts and two hundred and seventeen Boy Scouts. There are now Emplorer Posts in the area at the present time.
