WILBUR W. MAGILL

Wilbur W. Magill, 71, died of a heart attack at 6 a. m. Feb. 7, at his home in Lexington, Ky.

Mr. Magill was a specialist in fruits and served for 41 years at the University of Kentucky Cooperative Extension Service, retiring in 1963.

Known throughout the state for his promotion of commercial and home fruit plantings, he was one of the persons responsible for the strawberry production as a source of income for low income farmers in the state.

In 1956 he was awarded the Wilder Medal by the American Pomological Society, and in 1957 he received the superior service award from the U. S. Dept. of Agriculture. Mr. Magill was a member of the Gamma Sigma Delta, Epsilon Sigma Phi, National Peach Council, American Pomological Society, American Society of Horticultural Science and the Kentucky State Horticultural Society. He was a Kentucky Colonel and was a member of the First Methodist Church.

A native of Franklin, Ind. Mr. Magill was a son of the late Edward Curtis and Addie Patterson Magill. Graduating from Purdue University, he was in the extension service of N. C. State College from 1920 to 1922 and was assistant county agent at

Vincennes, Ind. for one year. He was a veteran of World War I.

Survivors include his wife, Mrs. Marguerite Hensley Magill; two daughters, Mrs. F. G. Ham, Madison Wis. and Mrs. James E. Lacy, Lexington; a brother, H. I. Magill and a sister, Miss Hollie Magill, both of Franklin Ind.; eight grandchildren and two nephews.

Mrs. Magill is the daughter of the late Augustus F. and Lottie Neavis Hensley, and has two sisters living in Burnsville, Mrs. I. R. Laughrun and Mrs. Hobart Ray, whom she visits often.

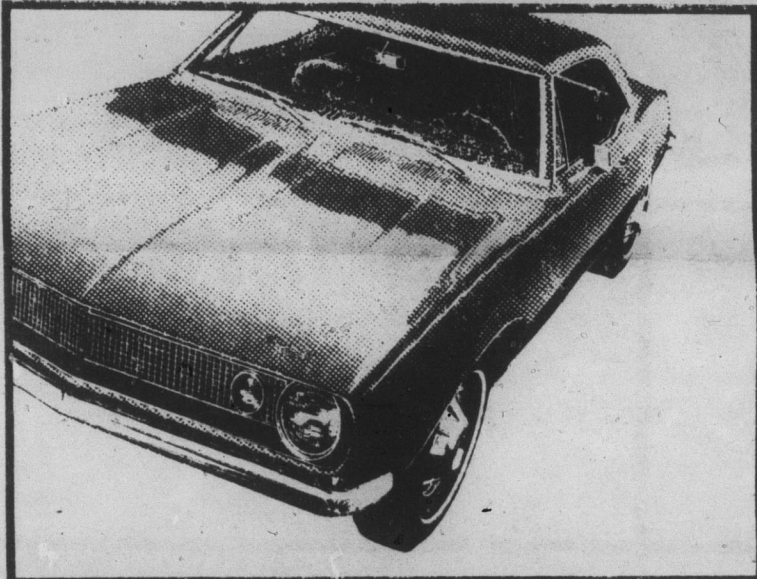

During the eight-week course, he was trained to operate and maintain air compressors engines, crane shovels and tractors.

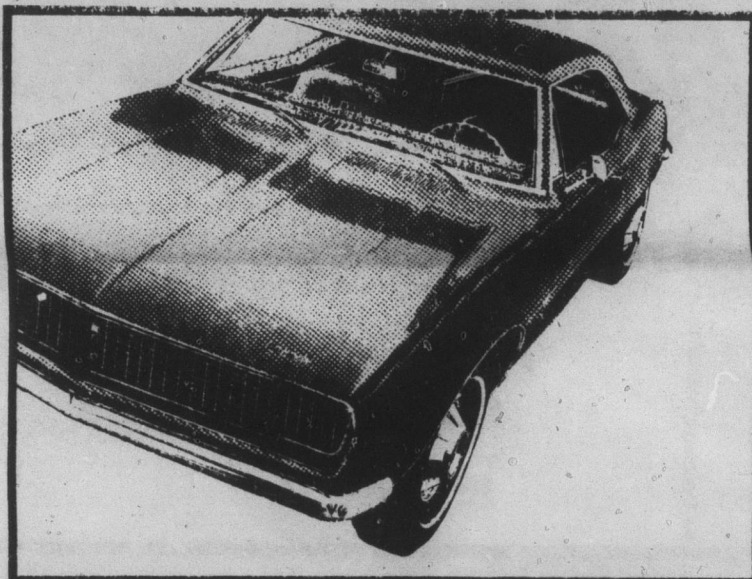

Men's Club Will Meet Monday

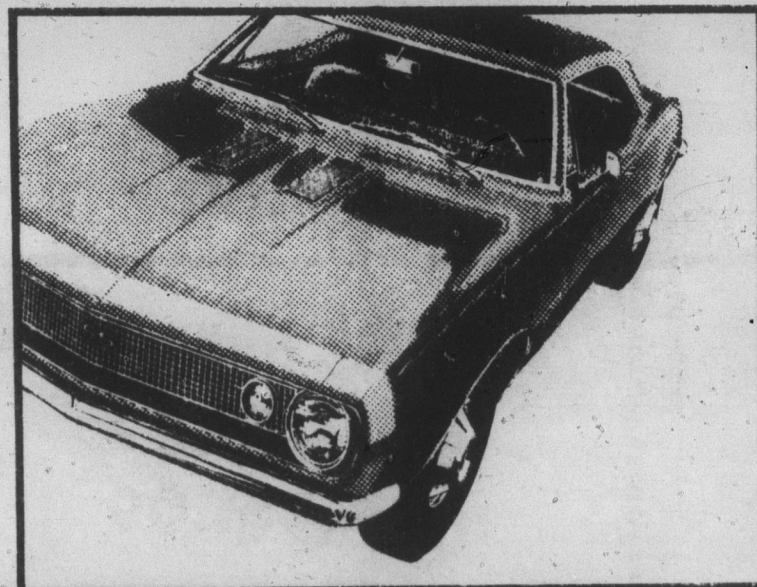

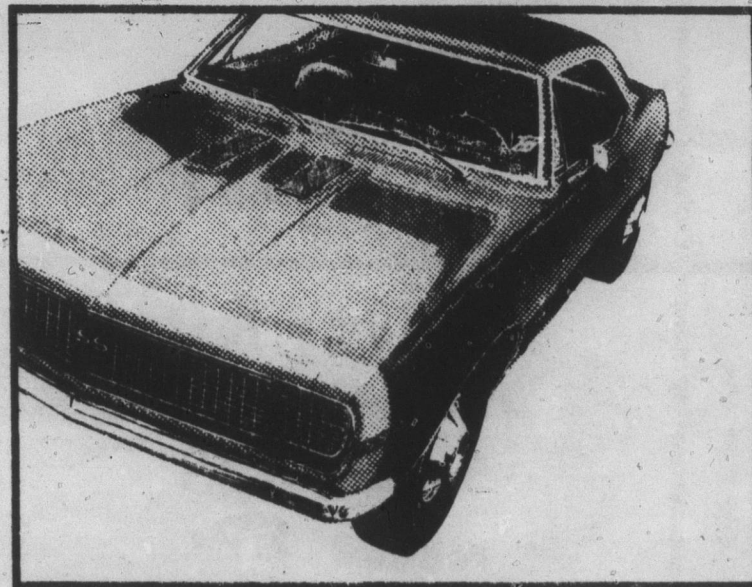
