Snails Bother Crops In County

Slugs and snails are proving troublesome to vegetables, flowers, and shrubs, especially in shady, damp places. Tobacco, shrubbery, and vegetable plants next to a meadow are usually more easily damaged.

Treatment: Poisoned baits have been used extensively. Baits containing calcium arsenate plus metaldehyde are usually most effective. Read the label and do n t put poison bait on strawberries or other crops that you are going to eat.

Trenches plowed or dug around the bed or field and filled with lime or fertilizer have been found helpful.

A general cleanup of old trash, lumber, brush and other debris would be a preventive measure.

Cold, damp weather is favorable for slugs and snails. Sur shine and warm weather soon be here. Lets hone the snails will leave with the bad weather.

The East Tennessee Antique Dealers Association held their monthly meeting Sunday, June 4, at the Pendulum Shop in Burnsville, N. C.


Plans are being made for the annual Antiques Show in Br'stol, Tennessee to be held August 18, 19, 20 in the Armory.

STRAWBERRY CAKE ROLL

10 servings

1 cup sifted enriched selfrising flour*

4 eggs, separated

34 cup sugar

1/4 teaspoon almond extract Confectioners' sugar Strawberry Filling

Measure flour. Beat egg whites until frothy. Add $\frac{1}{2}$ cup sugar, 2 tablespoons at a time, beating until meringue forms soft peaks. Set aside. Beat egg yolks until thick and lemon colored. Gradually beat in remaining sugar and almond extract. Fold egg yolk mixture into meringue. Sift flour mixture over egg mixture and fold in gently. Turn into waxed paper-lined 101/2 x 151/2-inch jelly roll pan. Bake in preheated 375° oven, 15-18 minutes, or until cake is done. Loosen sides and turn out onto clean towel previously dusted with confectioners sugar. Remove wax paper. Beginning at narrow end, roll up cake and towel together. Cool. Unroll and spread with Strawberry Filling. Reroll and chill until served.

1 pint fresh strawberries.
