Durham Named Head Of Dept.

EDITOR'S NOTE: Below are illustrative answers by the Veterans Administration to some of the many current questions from former servicemen and their families. Further information on veterans benefits may be obtained at any VA office.

Q — I live in a small community and have been unable to find a lending agency which will grant me a loan to purchase a home. How may I obtain a GI loan?

A — Get in touch with your nearest VA Regional Office to see if your county is on the approved list for VA direct loans. If it is, you may be able to obtain a VA direct loan for home purchase.

Q — I have National Service Life Insurance and it has been in force on the ordinary life plan since 1945. My children are now grown and self-sustaining and I have been giving some thought to discontinuing the payment of premiums and take a paid-up

policy. If I do, will my dividends be discontinued?

A — No, but they will not be as large as on your existing policy. If you take a paid-up policy, the amount of insurance in force will be less than the present face value of your policy. The dividends will be computed on this reduced insurance coverage.

Q — My husband still has his \$10,000 National Service Life Insurance. I know that he has not changed the beneficiary since our marriage. He tells me that it is not necessary to change the beneficiary because the insurance is automatically paid to the wife of the veteran.

A — Your husband is badly misinformed. The Veterans Administration must pay the designated beneficiary of record, even though it is evident that this will result in an inequity. If he desires that you receive the proceeds of his NSLI policy, he must name you as the beneficiary.

BOONE — Dr. Harvey R. Durham, assistant professor of mathematics at Appalachian State for the past two years, has been named chairman of the university's department of mathematics to replace Dr. Paul B. Patterson, who has retired.

He joined the Appalachian faculty Sept. 1, 1965. He is married and is the father of one child.

Dr. Patterson, who came to Appalachian in 1962, received his B. S. degree at Colgate University and the Master's and Ph.D. degrees at the University of Florida.
