

Survey To Be Made

Information about the extent to which children are immunized against smallpox, polio, measles, whooping cough, tetanus and mumps will be obtained in a survey here the week of September 18, Director Joseph R. Norwood of the Census Bureau Regional Office in Charlotte announced today.

Local residents will also be asked about the medical care received by children under 13 who have not been immunized against all of these diseases. The information will be used in research by the U. S. Public Health Service.

In addition, the surveyors will obtain information about em-

ployment and unemployment to be used by the U. S. Department of Labor's Bureau of Labor Statistics in preparing current national figures.

The survey will be taken simultaneously in other areas of the U. S. to obtain data from a representative sample of the nation's households. All answers will be confidential, and the facts obtained will be used for statistical purposes only.

Moretz Named As Interim Director Of WAMY

Mr. H. C. Moretz, Jr., of Boone, has been named to serve as interim executive director of W.A.M.Y. Community Action while the agency's Board of Directors considers applications for the position.

Moretz, who is also director of the Neighborhood Youth Corps, was appointed to the position Friday by a unanimous vote of a committee of the corporation's Board of Directors, according to the Board Chairman Dr. W. H. Plimmans.

In announcing the appointment,

Dr. Plimmans said the Executive Committee was "extremely happy that a member of W. A. M. Y.'s staff was both qualified and willing to take on the job of directing the four-county agency during the interim period."

"The Executive Committee feels," he concluded, "that because Moretz is already familiar with the overall W.A.M.Y. program, he will be able to keep things running smoothly and give our personnel committee the time and freedom it needs to find and recommend the best man available to fill the position."

Moretz will continue to serve as director of the Neighborhood Youth Corps and will receive a salary increase to compensate for his extra duties during the interim period, Dr. Plimmans said.

No immediate or drastic changes in W.A.M.Y.'s programs or personnel are anticipated, Moretz said Monday.

"We will be busy for the next two months changing over from one program year to the next," Moretz said. "We'll be concentrating on making sure all our workers understand the new program, and are working together in a coordinated effort."

"I am also happy that William H. Thomas will continue to serve as deputy director during this interim period," Thomas is also acting director of the program's planning staff.

Moretz has served as director of the Neighborhood Youth Corps for 13 months. During that period the local program has become one of the best rural Youth Corps programs in the nation, according to Dept. of Labor officials.

Moretz is a native of Watauga county, and was educated in the county schools. He holds a B. S. degree from Appalachian State University in Business and Social Studies, and has credits from the University towards a Masters Degree in Guidance and counseling.

He has also taught in the public schools in Watauga and Yadkin counties, and has worked as managing director of Elkin Business College.

He is married to the former Phyllis Wilson of Watauga County. They have four children, and are members of Bethany Lutheran Church.

World War I Veterans To Meet

Marshall — W. N. Knight of Charlotte, State Adjutant, Veterans of World War I, stated today, that a meeting of World War I veterans has been scheduled for Sunday afternoon, at 2:30 o'clock in the County Courthouse, C. D. Howell of Asheville, Junior Vice Commander of the North Carolina Department will be the principal speaker.

Knight, emphasized that with the passage of the 1967 pension bill by both Houses of the Congress and the signing of this legislation by the President on August 31st, would increase the non-service-connected pensions by 5.4 percent. In addition it will make an additional increase to the "Housebound Veterans" and some additional benefits to a number of widows of the World War I veterans.

All World War I veterans are cordially invited to attend the afternoon sessions where a complete review will be made by the State Junior Vice Commander.
