#### Yancey Farmers Use Modern Methods To Fertilize



A helicopter will fly over three Yancey County farms November 2, but it will be dropping fertilizer instead of bullets, according to E. L. Dillingham, County Extension Chairman of Yancey County.

This will be a special demonstration of how to get fertilizer on pastures that are too steep for other equipment. 100 acres of land will be fertilized on the farms of George King, Oscar Wilson and Rex Yelton. The King farm is located on the Green Mountain Road in the Mine Fork community. The Wilson and Yelton farms are located in the Possum Trot community near Bald Creek.

These farms will use the concentrated phosphate supplied to unit test demonstration farmers by the T.V.A. The flying company will charge two and onehalf cents per round for spreading the fertilizer.

The public, and especially the interested farmers who may want to apply fertilizer next spring by heliconter are invited to the demonstrations.

## Postmaster Urges Early Christmas Mailing

The Post Office Department breaks records for mail volume every Christmas but 1967 may break more records than any previous year, Postmaster Buck said today.

In urging local citizens to mail early for Christmas, Mr. Buck said the four-state Atlanta Region, of which hs office is a part, will handle 100 million more pieces of mail this Christmas than last year.

"This increase alone is equal to the total volume of mail in some countries for an entire menth," he said.

"Unless the people cooperate and get their Christmas mailing done early, we are going to be hopelessly swamped just before Christmas," he said. "Things will get awfully chaotic."

Mr. Buck said Regional Director C. Banks Gladden today informed h m that the volume of mail to be 'handled in North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia and Flor da will total 1,276,700,000 (Billion) pieces in December — an increase of 100 m llion or 8.4 per cent over last December.

The postmaster emphasized this figure represents the total incoming and outgoing p'eces to be handled by all postal stations, which is the bas's for determining the amount of Crhistmas employment.

Nationally, Mr. Buck said, the Post Office Department is expecting a record Christmas volume of about nine billion originating pieces of mal.

"The Post Office Department has completed its planning for the holiday season," Mr. Buck sa'd. "We can handle the expected increases in mail and get it delivered on time if people will mail early."

Mr. Buck said experience in the Atlanta Region has shown that 65 per cent of all Christmas mail is delayed until the final 12 work days just before Christmas Day itself.

Mr. Buck urged that these dates be observed for domestic surface ma'l:

-Gifts to distant states, December 4.

Greeting cards to distant places, December 10.
 Gifts and greeting cards to

nearby areas, December 18.

Mr. Buck sa'd gifts and greeting cards sent by domestic air

mail should be in the post office by December 19.

The postmaster said special attention again will be placed on the delivery of mail to servicemen in Vietnam and surrounding areas. But the following deadlines have been set:

—Gifts weigh ng more than five pounds sent by surface pos-
