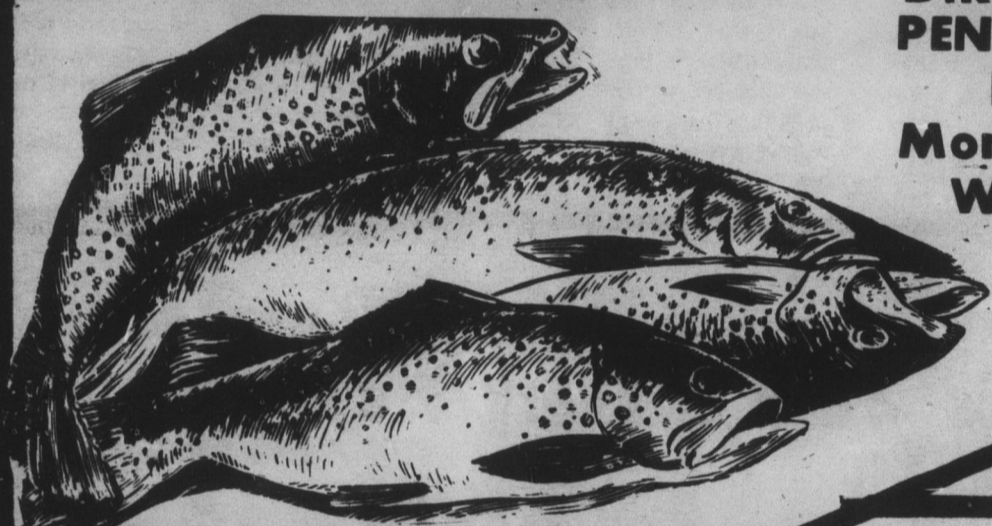
The Intermediates Training Union Dept. of First Baptist will be given a Halloween party on Saturday night, the 28th.
