## FRENCH CLUB

 On November the third, Le Cercle Francais of East Yancey High School composed of thirty-nine students took a bus trip to Pinehurst, North Carolina. They were accompanied by their French teacher, Mrs. Griffith and Mrs. Cecil Anglin mother of one of the students. Also their good natured and patient bus driver, Mr. Harold Wyatts. The Yancey County activity bus was the source of transportation. The purpose of going to Pinehurst was to eat in a French restaurant with a French atmosphere. There were two choices for a meal. ## STANFORD ACHIEVEMENT TEST

The Stanford Achievement Test measures a student's achievement in math, English, reading, science, social studies, spelling, arts and humanities, business and economics and technical comprehension.

**SCHOLASTIC APTITUDE TEST**  
 The Scholastic Aptitude Test of the College Entrance Examination Board, will be given to the juniors and seniors of East Yancey High School and numerous other high schools on December 2. This test is required for admissions to most of the colleges in the U. S. The SAT measures both verbal and mathematical aptitude. It is taken only by those juniors and seniors who are planning to further their education in college.

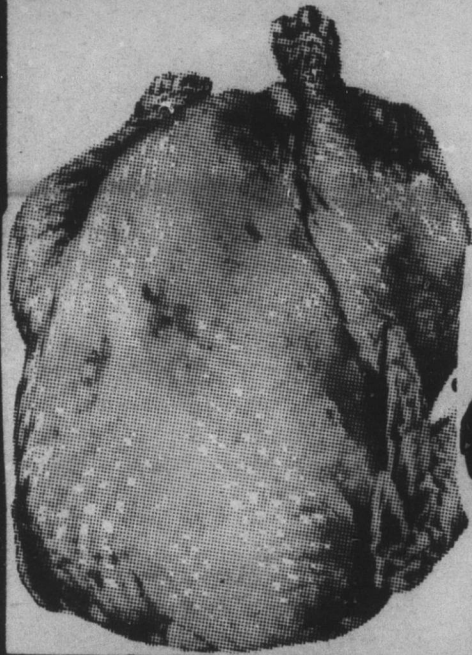

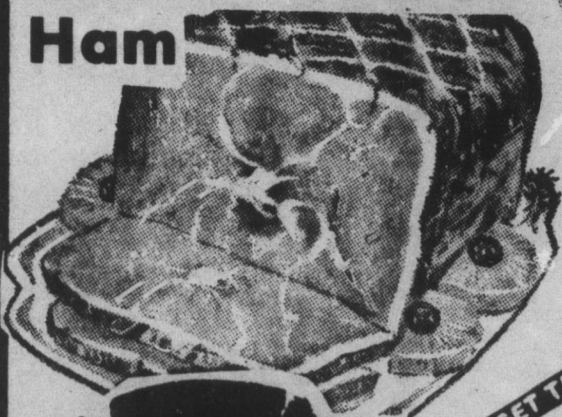
