

Older Citizens Should Contact Social Security Office In Filing Claims

All older people in the Asheville district office area covered by the medical or "doctor bill" insurance part of Medicare, who have had medical expenses of over \$50 in 1966 or 1967 — but have not filed claims for payment on these expenses — should contact the Social Security Office for any help needed in filing these claims right away, James E. Robertson, Social Security district manager, declared Tuesday.

Robertson strongly advised all such Medicare beneficiaries to "get in touch with us without delay, since there is a time limit for filing these claims for benefits under Part B of Medicare. Particularly for medical expenses incurred in 1966 this time limit is fast approaching."

He explained that as a general rule claims for payment must be filed "no later than the end of the calendar year following the year in which the medical services are furnished."

He reminded Medicare beneficiaries that in general they are responsible for the first \$50 (the deductible) of covered expenses in the year. Medicare will then pay 80% (\$4 out of \$5) of the remaining reasonable charges.

"Because of a special rule, called the 'carry-over rule,' some people do not even have to have medical expenses totaling \$50 to file a claim for payment. This rule is explained on Page 21 of your green Medicare Handbook.

"If you have any question as to whether certain medical expenses are, or are not, covered by Medicare — or if you simply don't know how to file a claim for payment, or have delayed filing for any other reason — get in touch with our office now.

"If you yourself cannot telephone or call in person, have someone call or come in to see the Social Security representative for you (with your Medicare card and the itemized bills).

"Your Social Security representative will be at the Court house in Burnsville, North Carolina on December 26, and January 6, between 9:30 a. m. and 12:30 p. m."

"The World Made Flesh" To be Presented By NBC

"The Word Made Flesh" will be presented by NBC Public Affairs, in cooperation with the National Council of Churches, in color from the Washington National Cathedral on Christmas Day, at ten a. m. on Channel 5.

"The Word Made Flesh" will be a special broadcast of scripture and song portraying the basic unity of all Christian believers and marking the birthday of the Prince of Peace, the day when "the Word was made flesh and dwelt among us."

Taking part in this service in the 14th century-style Gothic cathedral in Washington, D. C., will be the Very Rev. Francis B. Sayre Jr., Dean of the Wash-

ington National Cathedral, who will preside. The distinguished guests will deliver the Christmas meditation.

Other participants in the program, representing many denominations of the Christian faith, include Archbishop Iakovs, Orthodox, New York City; the Rt. Rev. John M. Burgess, Episcopal Suffragan Bishop of Massachusetts; the Rev. Theodore F. Adams, Baptist, Richmond, Va.; the Rev. Dr. Mossie A. Wyker, Disciples of Christ, Berea, Ky.; and the Rev. W. Lou's Quinn, Roman Catholic, Washington.

Music for the service will be provided by the cathedral's choir of men and boys, with Dr. Paul Callaway as director; and the brass choir of the U. S. Marine Band, Capt. Dale Harp- ham, director.

The Washington National Cathedral is especially appropriate for this special ecumenical service. The idea for the cathedral first originated with George Washington when he asked Pierre L'Enfant to plan a "great church for national purposes in the capital city." When Congress granted the charter creat-

ing the Cathedral Foundation in 1893, it called for a "House of Prayer for All People" to be established. Under construction since 1907, that "House of Prayer" is now known as the Washington National Cathedral. It will not be fully completed until 1965.
