MANY CRAFTS BEING SOLD THROUGH WAMY MARKETING PROGRAM

Rag dolls, corn shuck dolls, sock monkeys, and hand puppets; rag rugs and patchwork quilts; wood carvings and whistles; woven honeysuckle and split oak baskets

these are just a few of the products now being sold through the WAMY Mountain Crafts and Marketing Program. Initiated by the WAMY (Watauga, Avery, Mitchell, and Yancey counties) community action program in 1965, the program has grown to include more than 200 artisans. They received national recognition this summer when they were invited to participate in the Georg Jensen display of American Crafts in New York; the Smithsonian Folk Festival in Washington, D. C. (the Smithsonian ordered \$5,000 in crafts for permanent display); and the Newport Rhode Island Folk Festival.

This year the toys that have brightened the lives of mountain folk for generations will bring Christmas joy to youngsters throughout the United States.



Teacher Exams Scheduled At ASU Feb. 3

BOONE — Less than three weeks remain for prospective teachers who plan to take the National Teacher Examinations at Appalachian State University on February 3, to submit their registrations to Educational Testing Service, Princeton, N.J.

Registrations for the examinations must be forwarded so as to reach the Princeton office not later than Jan. 12. Bulletins of information describing registration procedures and containing Registrations Forms may ble obtained from M ss Hilda Everhart, psychological assistant, ASU Testing Center, Boone, N. C., or directly from the Educational Testing Service, Box 911, Princeton, N. J.

At the one-day session, a candidate may take the Common Examinations, which include tests in Professional Education and General Education, and one of the thirteen Teaching Area Examinations which are designed to evaluate his understanding of the subject matter and methods applicable to the area he may be assigned to teach.

Each candidate will receive an Admission Tcket advising him of the exact location of the center to which he should report. Candidates for the Common Examinations will report at 8:30 a. m. The Teaching Area Examinations will begin at 1:30 p.m.
