Mrs. Garrett Bailey Yancey's 'Mother Of The Year'

A well deserved and long overdue honor came to Mrs. Garrett Bailey, when she was chosen 1968 "Mother of the Year" for Yancey County.

The "Mother of the Year" contest was sponsored by the Merchants' Association and Radio Station WKYK. Contestants were asked to write letters of fifty words or less addressed to the Radio Station, telling why they felt their mother should be chosen. These letters were given unopened to a group of judges, who selected Mrs. Bailey as the one most worthy of this honor from a letter written by her daughter, Mrs. Hugh Pale. This letter was read over WKYK on Saturday evening, the 11th.

Mrs. Bailey, who celebrated her 75th birthday Dec. 21, is the former Lela Dixon. Born in Montgomery County, she was reared in Silver City, Cherokee County. She is a 1914 graduate of Meredith College, Raleigh. Before joining the music faculty of Y.C.I. in Burnsville in 1942, she taught public school music in Wilkes County.

After three years at Y. C. I., Mrs. Bailey went to Barnardsville, N. C. where she taught one year, returning to Burnsville at the end of the school year. She married Mr. Garrett Bailey, a Yancey County native, and a Burnsville attorney Jan. 18, 1923. Mr. Bailey died in 1940.

Mr. and Mrs. Bailey became the parents of five children: Mrs. Hugh Pale of Burnsville, Mr. Dixon Bailey of Burnsville, Mrs. Ralph Wilson of Midland, Mich., Mrs. Ernest Gardner of Annandale, Va., and Mrs. Martha Kilpatrick of Charlotte. Mrs. Kilpatrick passed away about two years ago.

After Mrs. Bailey's children were in school, she again took up her profession of teaching piano, and has been teaching continuously since that time. At present she has some 30 students, and holds classes six days a week, including two hours Saturday morning.

Mrs. Bailey's whole life has centered around her family, her church, and her profession. She is a member of the First Baptist Church, and participates in all the activities of the church. After the death of her husband she took over the responsibility of rearing and educating her family. Her children are living witnesses of her success in this field. Under her teaching hundreds of Yancey County children have a good foundation in piano, and many of them have gone on to get a degree in music.

Mrs. Bailey and members of her family were honored at a dinner at Nu-Wray Inn Saturday night, when she was showered with many beautiful gifts by the merchants.
