Given below is a partial list of new books acquired by the Avery-Mitchell-Yancey Regional Library and now available to patrons of the four public libraries in the three counties and through the bookmobiles operated throughout the three-county region.

**THIRTEEN DEVILS** by Gladys Spicer. A spine-tingling collection of devils from around the world which will make the reader shiver and shake—and laugh, too.

**THE INTELLIGENT DOG'S GUIDE TO PEOPLE OWNING** by Roland A. Browne. A practical handbook for novices that will enable both canines and humans to let the world go to the dogs with a minimum of fuss and friction.

**MARS: PLANET FOR CONQUEST** by Erick Bergaust. The story of the United States' plans for the flight to and exploration of the planet Mars.

**MY PLEASURES AND PALACES** by Harry Hussey. From Sun Yet-Sam to Mac Tse-Tung—memoirs of 40 years in China.

**WATCH FIRES TO THE NORTH** by George Finkel. The story of Lucius Bedwyr Marchus, who was 13 years old when he had his first encounter with heathen-pirates and learned that the long peace following the withdrawal of the Roman legions from Britain was coming to an end.

**ASSAULT** by Michael Kekly. The portrayal of the imperfect stuff of which heroes are made and of the dark ugly ground from which heroism grows

makes this an honest, intelligent and suspenseful novel.

**ASIMOV'S MYSTERIES.** A baker's dozen of Isaac Asimov's best scientific-fiction stories.

**THE MAN WHO SAVED ROBINSON CRUSOE** by James Poling. Here is the incredible story of how Woodes Rogers met Selkirk, who had been a castaway on Juan Fernandez Island in the Pacific for more than four years and how the privateer captain and the castaway sailed to adventures even stranger than those Selkirk had experienced on his lonely island.

**THE PEPPER GARDEN** by John Slimming reveals the heart and mind of a man who, when the chips are down, again may stand up and give battle. To read it is to enter an enchanted, beautiful and often brutal world.

**JEAN COCTEAU: The Man and The Mirror** by Elizabeth Spriggs and Jean-Jacques Kihn with drawings and photos. An intimate portrait of an amazing personality, against the

**THE EVOLUTION OF THE STARS: How They Form, Age and Die**, edited by Thornton Page and Lou Williams Page, with more than 100 photos, drawings and diagrams. The list of distinguished contributions to this volume includes astronomers, astrophysicists, chemists and geologists.

**ZOO ANIMALS** by Donald F. Hoffmeister. Handbook with pictures of many animals in color, with brief descriptions.
