Rev. Ben Lee Ray, pastor Garssy Creek Baptist Church, Spruce Pine and Charles Grindstaff, Webb Fune al Home, Spruce Pine, have been named Chairman for Mitchell, Avery and Yancey Counties for the Founders and Bulders Program of the Baptist Children's Homes of North Carolina

As County Chairmen, Rev. Ray and Mr. Grindstaff will provide leadership and guidance for the numerous volunteers in these counties as they all seek to raise the necessary monies for the establishment of a Children's Home for Western North Carolina.

The home, to be located on a 96 acre tract between Waynesville and Clyde, will provide group living care for about 50 boys and girls. It will also serve as a hub from which will radiate the numerous child care services of the Baptist Children's Homes. The campus will be built surrounding a six acre lake with four family style cottages for six boys and six girls with houseparents quarters, separating the children's wings.

Each cottage will have a centrally located dining area with living and play rooms provided to help the children develop in more normal home-like atmos-

Also on the campus will be a Campus Center housing the administrative, educational and recreational facilities and a superintendent's home. Target date for the admission of the first child is Septembler, 1969.
