## Drama "Tea And Sympathy" To Be Given At Mars Hill College

"Tea and Sympathy," the drama by Robert Anderson that scored a 21-month run when first produced in New York, has been listed as the next production of the Mars Hill College Division of Drama, where it will open on February 28, March 1, 3, and 4, with Miss Katie Swofford, senior Drama major at Mars Hill College, in the starring rolee of a swaggering house-master's unders anding wife in a boy's preparatory school.

The play's plot is concerned with a student condemned for his innocent association with an

instructor whose behavior resulted in his dismissal. Because the student likes long-hair music. disdains a crew haircut, is willing to play female roles in school plays and is generally a sensitive boy, he is harshly accused of unnatural relations.

In his innocence and loneliness he begins to doubt himself. When he despera ely tried to assert his "manhood" with a repulsive town tart, failure drives him nearly to suicide. The wife of the house-master, who leads the brutal ostracism of the boy, does her best to save the youngster from his school-

mates' fury, from her husband's persecution, and from his father's rage. In the end she offers to do the one thing that can restore the boy to some hope for the future, because of his genuine affection for her.

Jim Roberts will have the important role of the desolate, sensitive teen-age student. Dan Coble will appear as his roommae, a star athlete torn between decency toward his unfortunate comrade and a regard for his and popularity, Jin: Wyatt will be the unhappy boy's cliche-spouting father, and brick Tiley the house-master

thusband of Miss Swafford) whose over emphasized he-mannishness masks a streak of the same defect that he insists on attributing to the boy.

## Education Classes To Be Held Monday Night

Persons who enroll may learn to read and write, or they may review English, math, social studies, or science. However, the main objective is to raise adults to the educational level required for passing the high school equivalency test.

What is the High School Equivalency Program? It is a program whereby an adult who did not complete his high school education may take a series of tes.s to demonstrate his general education competence and be awarded a certificate recognized and generally accepted as equivalent to a high school diploma. The equivalency diploma is issued by the Sta'e Department of Public Instruction.

If you are 18 years old or older and would like to enroll in an Adult Basic Education Class, you are invited to attend this meeting Monday night, February 3. This meeting will determine whether or not there is enough interest for classes.
