Evangelist To Speak At West Burnsville Baptist Church

Reverend Robert White, who has been an evangelistic preacher all over the world will be speaking March 9th, 11 o'clock, at West Burnsville Baptist Church. Reverend White has preached the Word of God in Russia, Czechoslovakia, and East Germany.

Reverend White, A Southern Baptist Minister, has been pastoring churches for the past 16 years. He has also served as State Speaker for his church. He was appointed by the Governor of Louisiana to serve on the Committee on Alcoholism.

The Reverend Mr. White is appearing in this area as Area Representative for Underground Evangelism, which is a literature, Gospel broadcasting and missionary outreach to the peoples of the communist world. It is active in 12 communist lands through means of "smuggling" small pocket-size Bibles into Russia, short-wave Bible-teaching broadcasts and is now assisting over 300 "national" Christian workers behind the Iron Curtain as "Missionaries to their own people."
