He will do so when the North Carolina Dairy Products Association holds its annual convention at Pinehurst.

One of the "milkmen" who will be talking is Governor Bob Scott, the keynote speaker to the 400 dairymen, suppliers and guests at the Carolina Hotel on

Thursday at 9:30 a. m.

Others talking will include North Carolina State University dairy and food processing authorities.

F. Howard Suttle of Wilmington, President of the NCDPA, said "the economical cost of milk in North Carolina will be the theme of the 1970 convention."

Controversy over the price of milk has raged, along with the milkman's troubles with

the dog, the cat and the assorted other challenges, throughout the past year.

Suttle indicated that Governor Scott's address is expected to have the same effect on some of the critics of the industry as a glass of warm milk has on the insomniac at night or a crying baby at 4 o'clock in the morning.

The convention opens Tuesday, January 20 and concludes Friday, January 23.

Point Fabrics Plant in High Point, N.C.

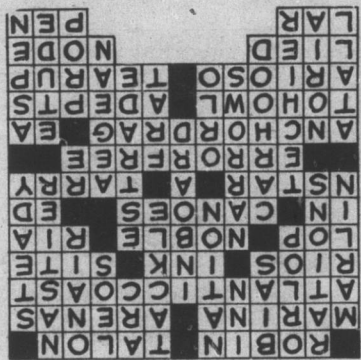
He succeeds William T. Barnett who has been named division manager of the Company's Hess, Goldsmith glass fabrics division.

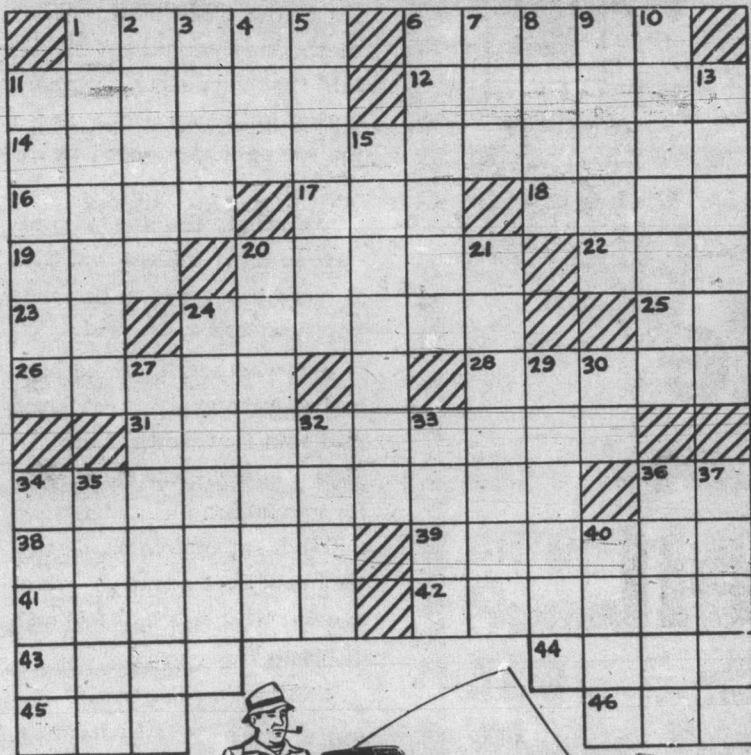
He is active in the Civitan Club and the Presbyterian Church. He is married to the former Nell Edge, also a native of Burnsville, and they have three children.
