Country Style Stew

- 4 medium size pared potatoes, cubed
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 (10-oz.) package frozen cut green beans

1. Empty contents of seasoned Crumbs mix into enclosed shaker bag. Drop about ½ of the meat cubes at a time into the seasoned Crumbs mix; shake bag to coat meat evenly. After all cubes are coated, reserve remaining seasoned Crumbs mix. Brown meat cubes in hot oil in 5-quart Dutch oven.

2. Measure 1 cup of liquid from the tomatoes; add to meat, stir, cover and simmer for 1 hour or until meat is nearly tender. Add tomatoes and remaining juice, onions, carrots, potatoes and salt. Simmer 30 minutes longer. Stir in green beans and remaining seasoned Crumbs mix; continue simmering for 20 minutes or until vegetables are tender, stirring occasionally to mix. Pour stew into heated serving dish.

Yield: 6-8 servings, 12 cups stew.
