ployed land surveyor.

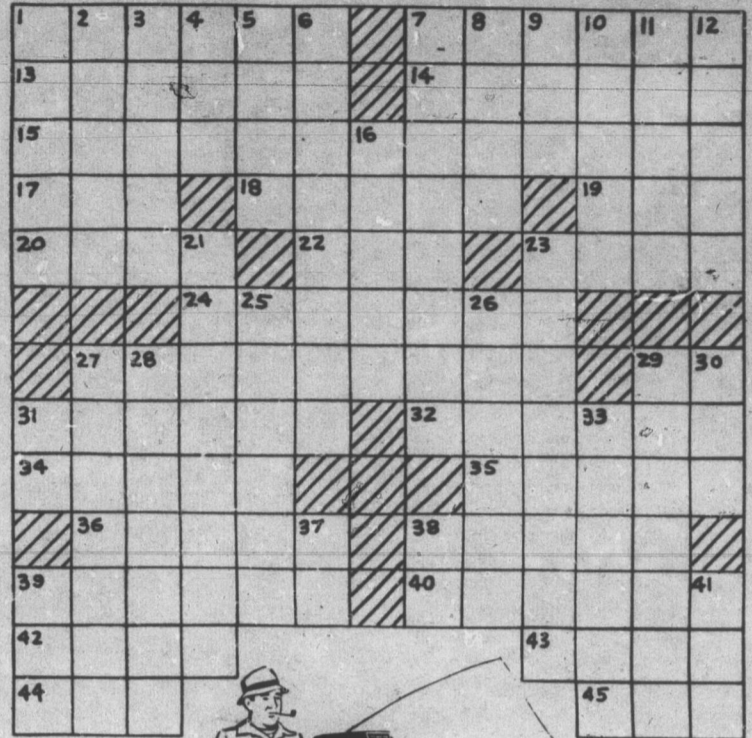
Both Yeager and Freeman

Freeman, 29, is a native
of Madison County. The son
of Mr. and Mrs. A. A. Freeman,
he is unmarried and makes his
home with his parents. A
graduate of Walnut High School,
he attended college, Western
Carolina College for two years.
He continued his studies else-
where in engineering and has
been self-employed for some
18 months.

Yeager and his wife, the
former Florence Koch of New
York, have lived in Waynesville
since his retirement from Wes-
tern Electric Co. 10 1/2 years
ago. They have two children,
John R. Yeager of Windsor,
Conn., and Mrs. Roseanne Par-
rett of Westfield, N. J.

Yeager majored for three
years in forestry at Iowa State
University and served with the
Army engineers in France dur-
ing World War I. He was with
Western Electric for 37 years.

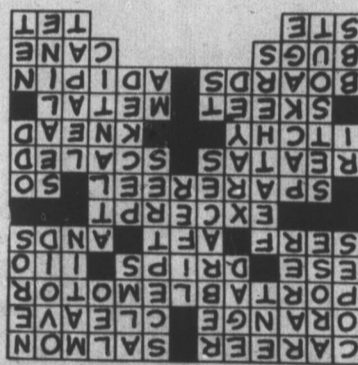
