District 16 Secretary, Mr. Fred Martin of Buncombe Co.

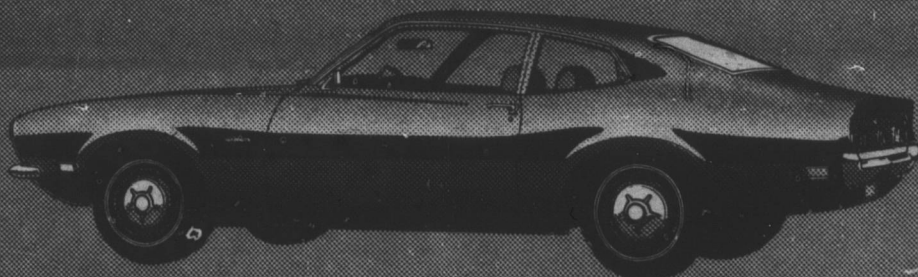

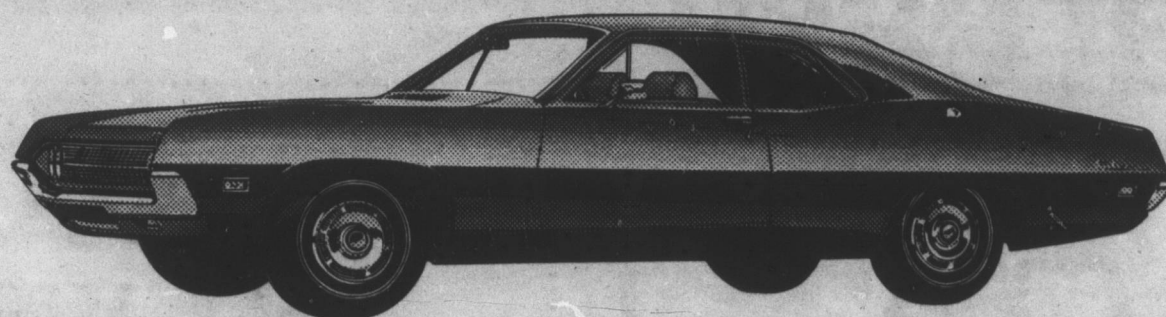
