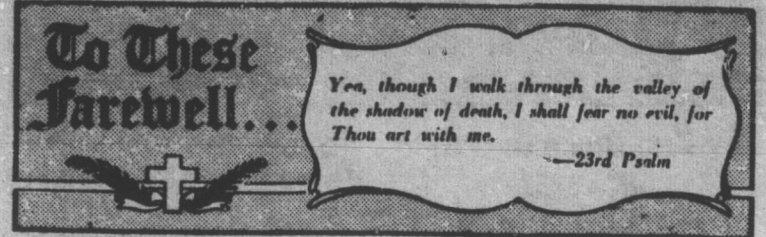
Six students from a Church
