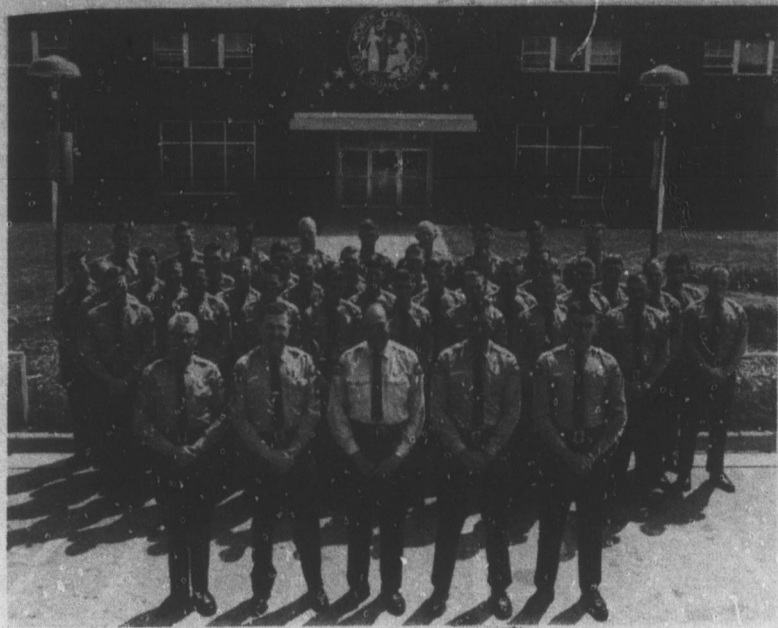

Cadette Scouts Present Fashion Show

VA Man Will Assist Vets

The N. C. Dept. of Veterans' Affairs, will have Jack C. Winchester, District Officer in the Courthouse with the County Service Officer at Burnsville, N. C. the second and fourth Thursday of each month from 11:00 a. m. to 3:00 p. m. to assist with veterans and their dependents' benefits.

Mr. Winchester stated that veterans who had more than 180 days of regular creditable active service (other than for training purposes only), on or after February 1, 1955 are entitled to education or on-job training of 1 1/2 months for each month served up to 36 months. In some cases entitled can amount to more than 1 1/2 months for each served, but not more than 36 months total under the new G. I. Bill.

He also urged all persons who had injury or illness or other conditions which originated in or was aggravated by

service, apply for service connection soon as convenient following separation from active duty.

There are also benefits for dependents of veterans, under certain cases following veteran's death.
