wore a camellia pink crepe sheath with embroidered front panel with matching accessories and a corsage of white rosebuds.

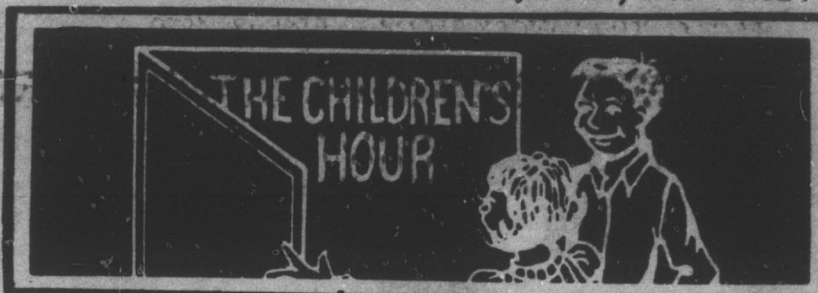
