### Highway 19E Project To Be Approved

The long awaited improvement of US 19E from Cane River to the Yancey - Madison County line is due to be approved by the State Highway Commission at its meeting in Raleigh this Thursday.

Highway Commissioner Novile Hawkins of Madison County, who has Yancey County in his territory, announced this week that the Commission's Primary Road Committee had approved the project and that the full Commission's approval is assured.

Hawkins said that some sections of 19E will be relocated


## PARKWAY PLAYHOUSE 'NEVER TOO LATE'
