Farmers Home Administration Supervisors attended a Farmer Programs Workshop on September 22 and 23, at Asheville, N. C.

James T. Johnson, State Farmers Home Administration Director, announced that the two day workshop for the supervisory personnel was on credit available to farmers through the agency.

Johnson and his staff included in their discussion recent authority given the agency to provide farmers with credit for establishing nonfarm-business enterprises. Johnson stated that many farmers have recently received this type of credit for building and equipping cabinet shops, upholstery shops, garages, trailer courts, barbershops, and similar business enterprises.

The agency now also has authority to provide credit to farmers to convert their farm enterprises to recreational enterprises.

Also discussed in this meeting was the concern of the agency about the substantial production losses that some farmers have suffered as a result of hailstorms and drought

this summer and the credit available to assist them.

Farmers Home Association offers a broad program of short, intermediate, and long-term credit to farmers for purposes varying from purchasing farm equipment to buying farms.

Farmers should contact the local county Farmers Home Administration Office which is located in Burnsville.
