



An Apology For Uncomfortable Change, by Arthur E. Sutherland. Pages 107, The Macmillan Co. N. Y. 1965.

"The old order changeth, yielding place to the new." This quotation, as applicable today in the history of America as it was in the time of Tenyson, forms the basis for Arthur E. Sutherland's discussion in his book, **An Apology For Uncomfortable Change**.

No one enjoys being uncomfortable, and since change always brings a certain amount of discomfort, the author states that in America we all go about our way of life pretending that nothing has changed. We need to be educated in what is under our eyes. We are dismayed and reluctant to admit that some things to which we have become deeply accustomed are not permanent. We yearn for the good old days of the lowly thatched cottage with birds singing outside the window, all of which brought a peace of mind better than any present-day tranquilizer. Yet, in our hearts we know that the man with the hoe has given way to an elec-

trical engineer, apartments have replaced log cabins, super-highways abound instead of muddy roads of the horse - and buggy days, and most Americans now live in cities, housing their people in everything but Currier and Ives farmsteads.

Although these economic changes sadden us, we have to admit that they are for the best, as likewise are the governmental and social changes of the times. The most frustrating part of our lesson in these cold facts is the necessity that in national, as in individual life, man must be reconciled to the continuing uncertainty that accompanies all change. "But our ancestors were at home in uncertainty, and they built a civilization in the faith that when the future came it would be good. We may well gamble on that chance; the other

holds no winnings. Our guiding aspiration amidst the doubts and dangers of the century ahead should be that for most of the things properly called the evils of change, the main remedy is for us to grow more civilized."
