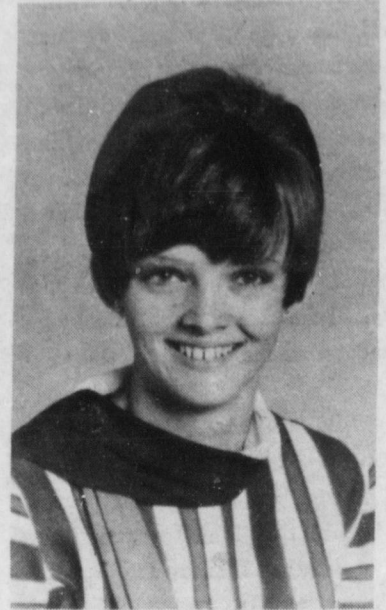
The Cane River High School Future Homemakers of America departed May 4, 1971 at 4:00 p. m. for Asheville.

Mr. Guyer showed slides on Entomology and slides of the Schaub 4-H Camp located near Waynesville, N. C.



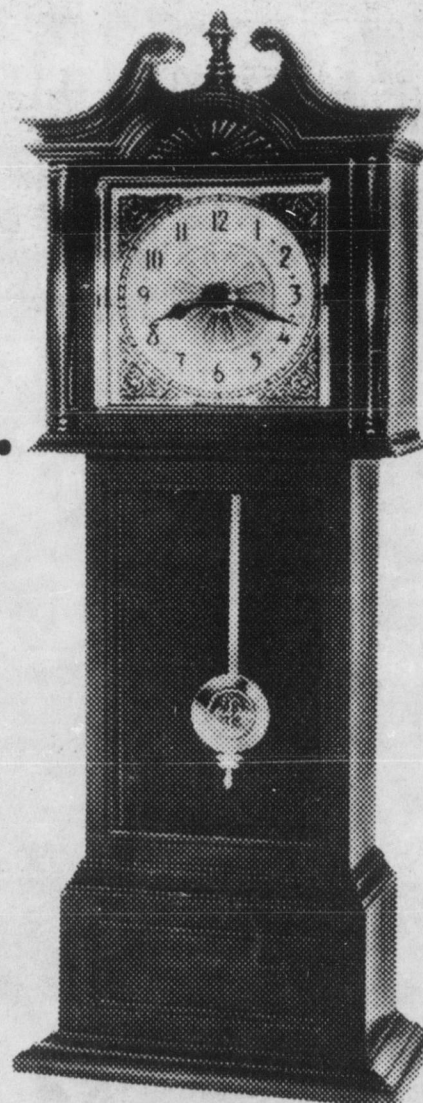
