 creased due to inflation and meeting the cost of living threefold since 1958. Mr. Robinson states: "To connect a new member today costs approximately three times what it cost in 1948, and your Cooperative has never raised the

cost of electric power delivered to the consumer. In fact, during this period we have made four reductions in the cost of power delivered to the consumer due to the fact that the members have been increasing their usage at a compounded rate of approximately 11%

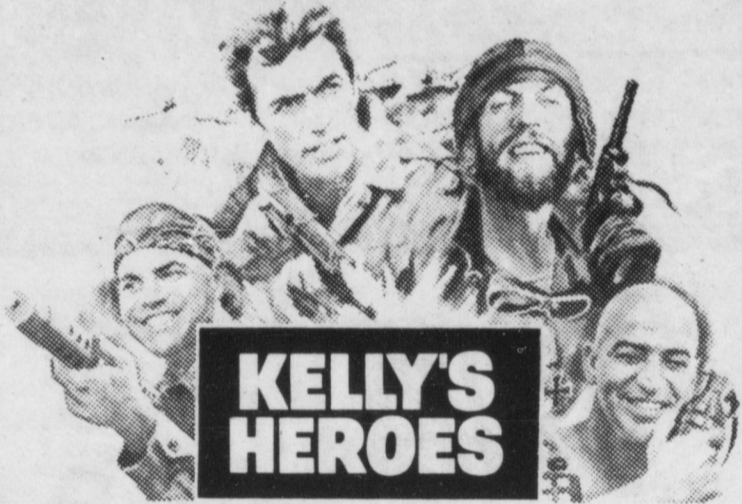
per year." This is the first upward rate adjustment in the history of the Cooperative.

The charge for a security light will be increased by 50¢ per month and maintenance & vandalism charges will be assumed by the Cooperative for this additional charge. Security lights under contract will not be raised until the contract has expired.

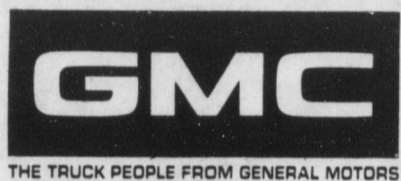
