Students To Work On Housing Survey

Three students from Appa – lachian State University will work as summer interns under the supervision of the directors of the two Local Development Districts in Region D this summer.

Region D was formed under Governor Scott's program of regionalization in May 1970, and includes the counties of Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Mitchell, Watauga, Wilkes, and Yancey.

Two local Development Districts, formed under the Appalachian Regional Commission have been located in the Region since 1967. The Mountain Scenic office in New land is Directed by Mrs. Ruth G.Johnson and the Blue Ridge office is in North Wilkesboro; Alfred Houston, Director.

Two interns, Jim Parsons of Lansing in Ashe County and Ken Nelson of Burnsville will be working in the area of housing. Ralph Ledford, originally from Hayesville in ClayCounty and now a resident of Boone, will work on compiling a Reconnaisance, or overall, sur vey of the Region.

Mr. Parsons and Mr. Nelson will be updating all surveys on housing needs in municipali ties and in rural townships. They will also try to determine opinion of public officials and private citizens about the need for housing, and the methods that are preferred for getting a regionwide housing organiza tion or a cooperating group of such organizations started.

His report will also show which of these plans have been carried out, or are in the process of being carried out; and, finally, which towns or coun ties need to have studies made or updated.
