Doctor Convalescing

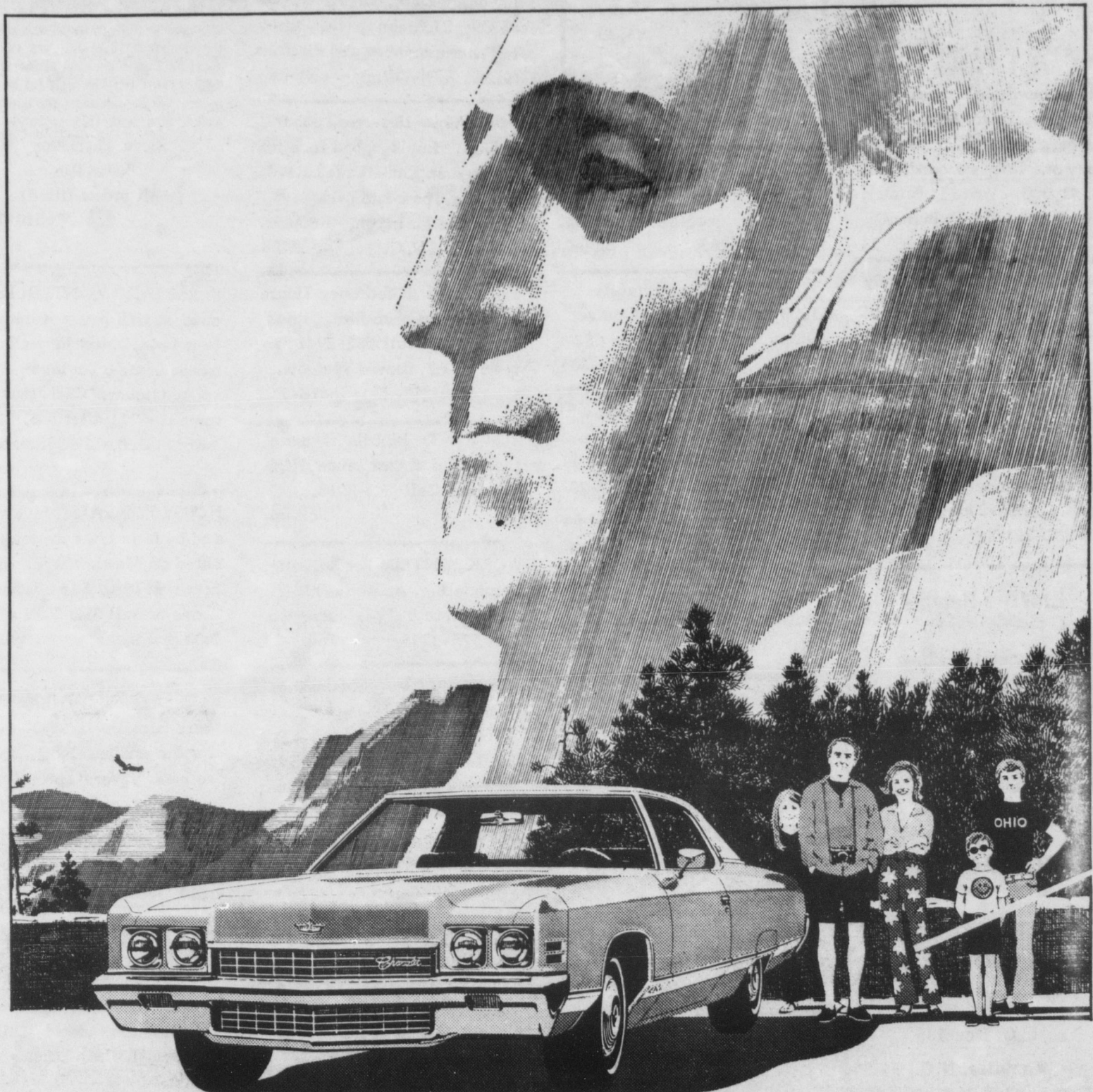

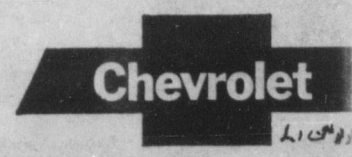
