Questions About Measles Campaign Answered

You have heard about the Measles Campaign and you are eager to support it, both for your own child's sake and for other children in the County, but you have a few questions. We'd like to clear them up before the campaign begins next Monday.

Maybe you'd like to know that this new vaccine is free and it is safe. Twenty-seven million children have received it already since 1969 without serious reactions. If your child has not had both measles shots, he should receive the one shot given at school because it will protect him against both kinds of measles. It will not hurt him to duplicate the shot he received previously. Only children who have proof of receiving both measles shots need not receive the new vaccine. (In any case,

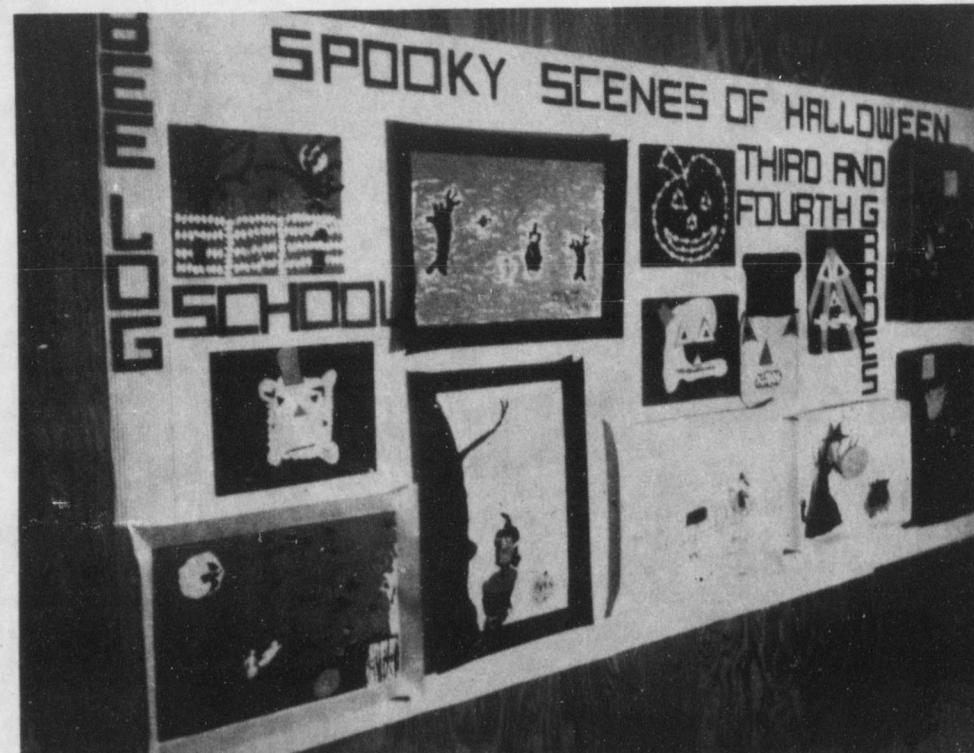
this vaccine will not harm a child who has had both shots before.) If your child is allergic to eggs or to feathers, he should not get the vaccine, or if your child is under medical care for an illness, consult your doctor about getting the shot. The vaccine is new in that it provides immunization against two diseases in a single shot. This combination vaccine provides a lasting protection against the two distinct viruses—the German or Black Measles (Rubella) and Red Measles (Rubeola). It has never been administered in our schools before.

Your child will probably not suffer any reactions, but some mild fever and rash might occur 6 - 10 days after the injection. A few children might develop joint pains 4-8 weeks after a shot has been given. This will not last more than 2-3 days at most and is nothing to worry about.

Since 95% of the children receiving the shot will never contract either kind of measles, it is worthwhile to give the Measles Campaign your enthusiastic support.

Miss Eve Lynn Joan Reeve, daughter of Mrs. Joan Reeve of Burnsville, has recently been awarded the distinction of being listed in "Community Leaders of America" for her work in founding Music in the Mountains.

This publication honors those individuals who have in some way, whether large or small, contributed to a better America by building better communities through service.

Miss Reeve has won Cash Awards and Three Gold Medals, besides winning the

Whitfield Fellowship for further study in Harpsichord, Theory and Composition. She has been listed in Who's Who of American Women 1969 and 1971 and National Social Directory 1971. She has also won several scholarships for study in Piano and Harpsichord.

A private teacher since 1952, Miss Reeve was Assistant Professor of Music at Lebanon Valley College from 1957 to 1969.

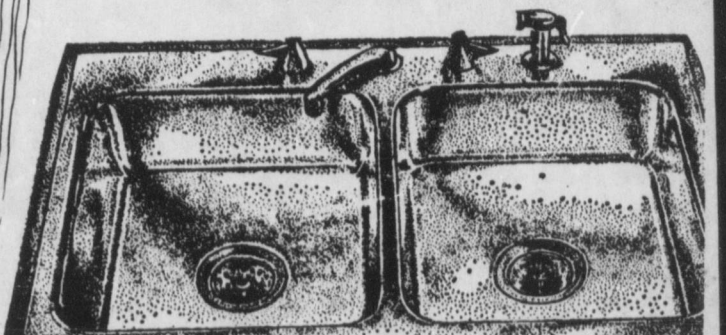
