

Student Council Class Representatives Announced

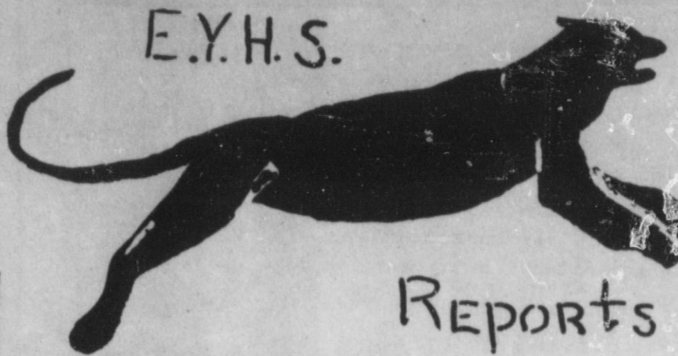
Class Representatives for the 1971-72 East Yancey Student Council have been announced.
