Weekend visitors of Mr. and Mrs. Bobby Jenkins were Mr. and Mrs. Jack Gouge

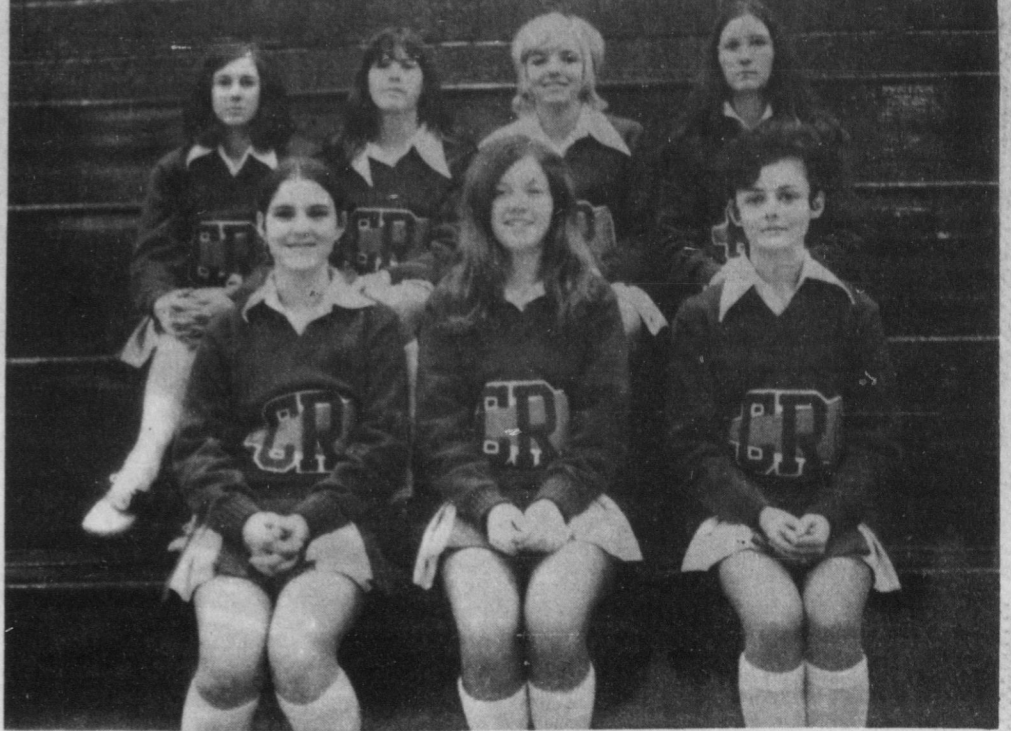
from Burnsville and Bertie Honeycutt.

### From The Yancey Extension Homemakers food news & cues

1 can cream of mushroom soup  
1/2 cup water  
1/2 cup american cheese  
1/4 cup sharp cheddar cheese  
salt and pepper to taste

Put half of potatoes in large casserole dish and fill only about two-thirds full to prevent boiling over. Cover with thin onion slices. Sprinkle with salt and pepper. Place sliced cheese on top of onions. Repeat with remainder of potatoes, onion and cheeses. Add diced ham if you prefer. Pour over the mushroom soup and water. Bake covered tightly for one hour in 350 degree oven. Remove cover and bake 20 or 30 minutes longer. If more liquid is needed, boiling hot milk may be added during baking.

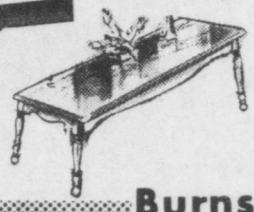
