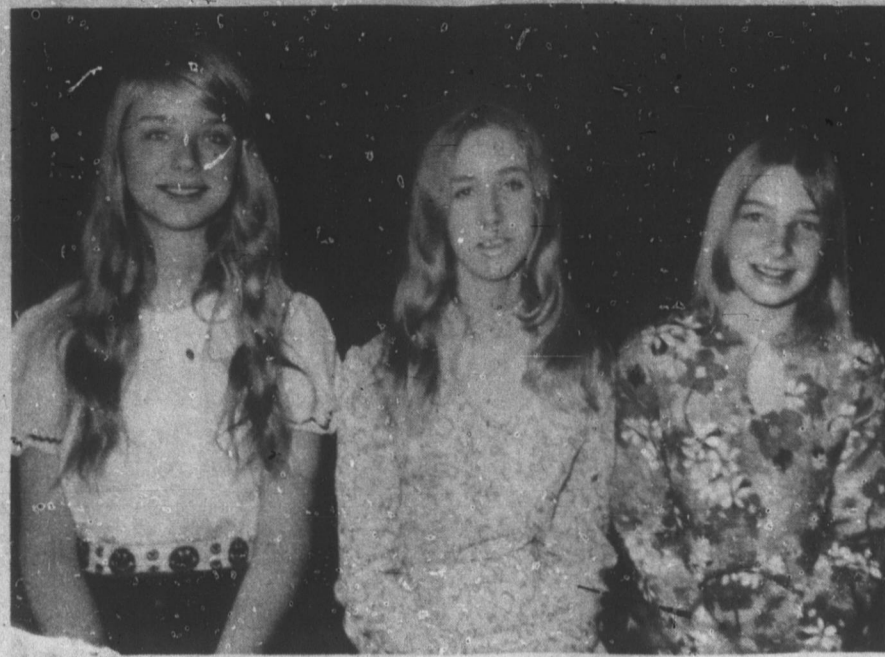




Smooth Square Dance Team

Applications are also being accepted for the "Junior Miss Division" of the Festival—that is girls from 8 through 12 years of age.

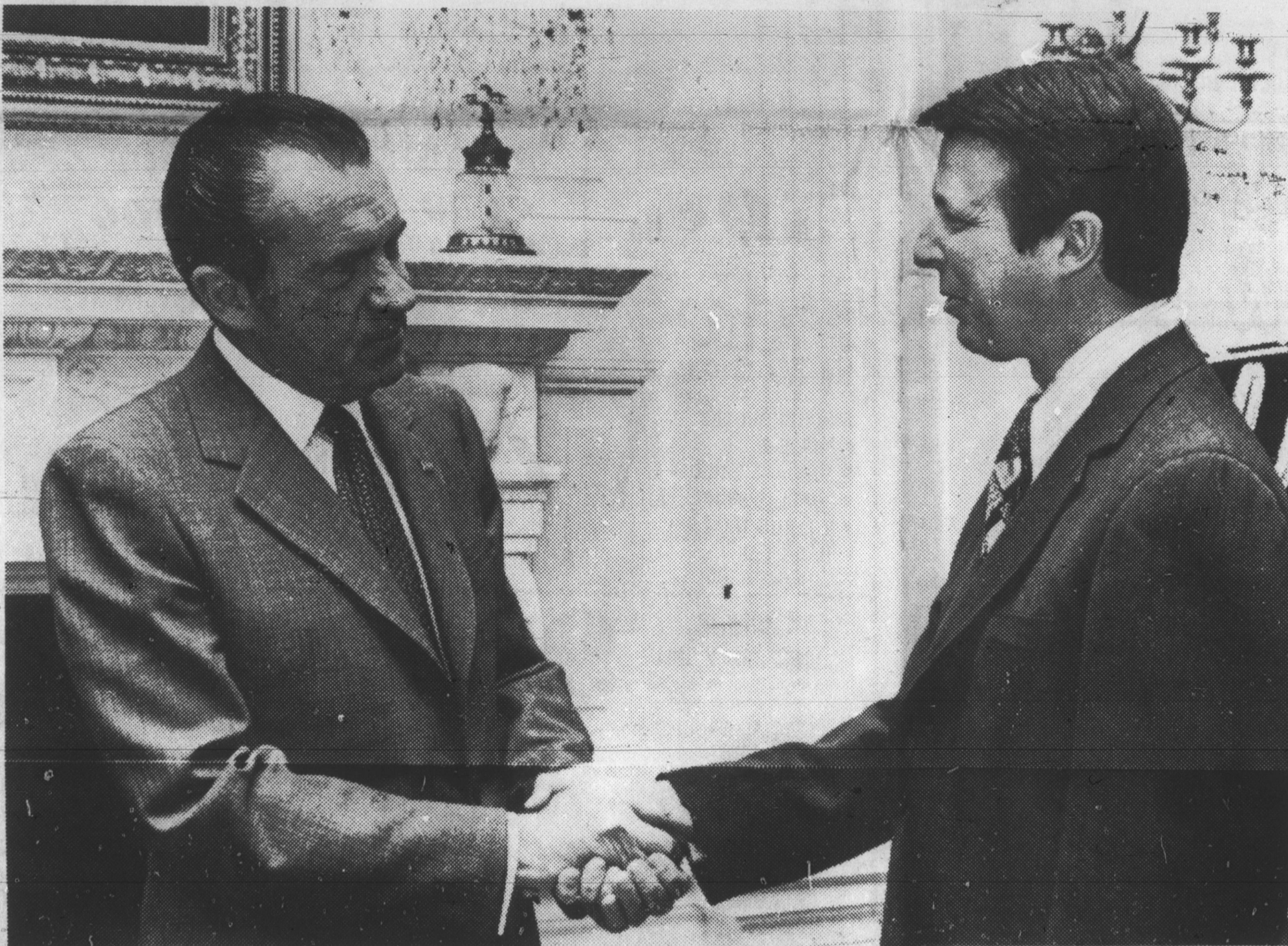
