Announces Approval Of Grants

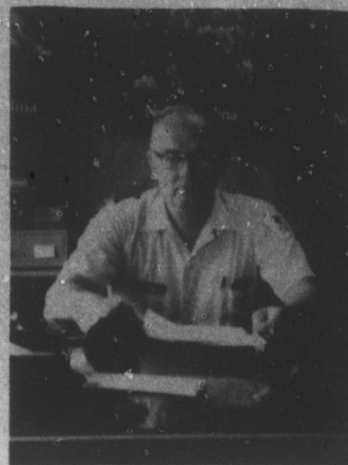
Congressman Roy A. Taylor Wednesday announced the approval of two grants totalling \$116,000 from the U.S. Office of Economic Opportunity.

A grant of \$50,000 was awarded to Four Square Community Action, Inc., Andrews, N.C., for general community programming; and a grant of \$66,000 was made to Western Economic Development Organization, Hazelwood, North Carolina, for general programming in Ashe, Wilkes, Burke, Yancey, Avery, Alleghany, Watauga, Mitchell, Clay, Caldwell, Henderson, Buncombe, Madison, Transylvania, Haywood, Jackson, Ma-

con, Swain, Graham and Cherokee Counties.

Both grants run from July 1, 1972 for 12 months.

Congressman Taylor also announced the approval of an ARC grant of \$77,040 for a second-year continuation for a solid waste management program in Alexander, Burke, McDowell and Caldwell Counties and a grant of \$233,152 for the continuation and expansion of an emergency radio communications system in Caldwell, Burke, McDowell, Alexander, Alleghany, Ashe, Avery, Watauga, Wilkes and Yancey Counties.

Social Security

Social Security District Manager, Mr. O. B. Cosby, Jr., said today that all social security beneficiaries who are on the benefit rolls in September will automatically receive a 20 percent increase. The increase is effective beginning with the payments for the month of September which will be received October 3.

The new law also includes a provision for automatic annual increases in Social Security benefits as the cost of living rises in the future.

Under the new law the maximum taxable amount of annual earnings that is counted for benefit and contribution purposes will rise from the present \$9,000 a year to \$10,800 in 1973 and to \$12,000 in 1974.

Thereafter, this amount will be adjusted automatically to keep pace with rising wages. These additional earnings will count toward the benefits payable to workers and their families in the future.



George Britton To Host Worship Service In Folk Music Style

Unique Worship Service Is Planned

A worship service in folk music style titled "You and Me and Ecology" will be presented by George Britton, a Music in the Mountains resident artist and folk singer of note, Sunday at 11:00 a.m. in Higgins Memorial Methodist Church, Burnsville.

Britton, teaching guitar, and lute in Music in the Mountains' summer camp at Mars Hill College, will be assisted by some of his students, by the pastor, the Rev. W. Ralph Jacks, and by encouraged congregation participation. He will play a 17-string renaissance lute in the service for which he composed words and music, using some traditional melodies and some borrowings from other singers, such as Jean Ritchie's "Black Waters." It was emphasized

that the service is ecumenical, having been used in churches of several denominations and in synagogues.

Rehearsal of the folk service will take place Saturday at 1:30 p.m. in the church, open to any who feel familiarity with text and music would help them in participation Sunday.

Britton will be remembered for his presentation of the folk service "These Are My Brothers" in the same church last summer and for his concerts on the Burnsville town square. He has recorded for Folkways, 20th Century and MGM.

Burnsville's own Eve Lynne Reeve on Harpsichord was one of the artists in Music in the Mountains' third concert of the annual chamber music series

here last Sunday afternoon in the Presbyterian Church. Others heard were Susan Fries on flute; Ruth Geiger, piano; Jon Peterson, oboe; Robert Fries, horn; Janet Peterson, clarinet; Daniel Phipps, bassoon.

Next in the series will be a concert of Beethoven, Saint-Saens and Borodin tonight at 8:00 p.m. in the Mars Hill College open air amphitheater, and at 3:30 p.m. Sunday in the Burnsville Presbyterian Church with music by Haydn, Chopin and Borodin.

Services will not be held at the First Presbyterian Church on Sunday morning. Instead, for this special Music in the Mountains program, joint services will be held with Higgins Memorial United Methodist Church,

Music in the Mountains will present George Britton in a concert of classic guitar and Elizabethan songs to the lute and guitar on Tuesday, July 18 at 8:00 p.m. in Spainhour Hall of the Moore Fine Arts Building at Mars Hill College, Mars Hill, North Carolina.

He will play a 17-string Renaissance lute made for him by Donald Wamock, one of the finest and foremost luthiers in the United States.

Mr. Britton has concertized extensively throughout the U.S. for the past 25 years. He has recorded for Folkways, ABC, Paramount, 20th Century and Fortress. Yancey County Country Store has some of his recordings.
