Free And Reduced Price Meal Policy For Yancey

Yancey County Schools today announced a free and reduced price me al policy for school children unable to pay the full price of me als served in schools under the National School Lunch and School Breakfast Programs.

Local school officials have adopted the following family size-income criteria for use in determining eligibility (shown at bottom of this article). Children from families whose imome is at or below those shown are eligible for meals free or at reduced prices. In addition, families not meeting this criteria but with other unusual expenses due to unusually high medical expenses, shelter costs in excess of 30 percent of income, special education expenses due to the mental or physical condition of a child, and disaster or casualty losses are urged to apply.

They may do so by filling in the application forms sent home in a letter to parents. Additional copies are avail able at the principal's office in each school. The information provided on the applica tion will be confidential and will be used only for the purpose of determining eligibility. Applications may be submitted any time during the school year.

In certain cases foster children are also eligible for these benefits. If a family has such children living with them and wishes to apply for such meals for them, they should contact the school.

In the operation of child feeding programs, no child will be discriminated against because of his race, sex, color or national origin. Under the provision of the policy the Principal will review applications and determine eligibility.
