Deyton and Patsy Fleming "Project Enlightenment" Mrs. Dempsey Hopson, Family Life Committee Chairman for the Yancey County Extension Homemakers will serve as chairman for "Project Enlightenment" which concerns learning experiences for the pre-school child. Elise D. Coley, of the Raleigh Public Schools, has edited a workbook entitled, "I Can Do It" which is designed to be used with the young child in helping him build self-confidence during the Pre-School years. The publication was printed by the N.C. Agricultural Extension Service-- supported by a grant from the N.C. Extension Homemakers Association. "I Can Do It" is about things parents can do to help their children become excited about learning things he can do. A child who is excited about things he can do is really ready to enjoy more experiences and meet new challenges. This charming booklet--designed to prepare the pre-schooler for school--will be fun for the child as well as other adults who use it. Copies are avail-

able from the County Extension Office or the Extension Homemakers Club members throughout the county. We highly recommend it to any parent or individual who works with pre-school children.
