Our recipes this week have been sent in by members of the Happy Homemakers Extension Club of Burnsville. When you put them together you have a complete meal which can be cooked right in the oven at the same time—a good way to conserve energy.

MEAT LOAF
(Golda Peterson)
2 lbs. ground beef
2 eggs
2 tbsp. onion
6 oz can tomato paste
20 saltine crackers
1/2 green pepper (diced)
1 tbsp. oil
Season to taste
Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
Mix meat, tomato paste, eggs,

onion, pepper, crackers and seasoning. Mold into loaf. Bake 40-45 minutes.

SCALLOPED POTATOES
(Doris Hunter)
4 cups potatoes (Diced)
2 pimento (diced)
Salt and pepper
1/2 green pepper
*1 1/2 cup medium whitesauce
1/2 cup grated cheese
Cook potatoes 5 minutes,
Drain. Add green pepper and pimento. Season to taste. Pour into well-oiled baking dish. Cover with white sauce to which cheese has been added. Bake 350 degrees for 50 minutes.

WHITE SAUCE
2 tbsp. margarine
3 tbsp. flour
1/3 tsp. salt

1 1/2 cup milk
Melt butter in saucepan. Blend in flour until smooth. Add salt. Add milk slowly, stirring rapidly. Bring to boil, stirring constantly. Reduce heat. Cook 1 minute stirring constantly.

REFRIGERATOR SLAW
(Vera Westall) p. 52
Homemakers Cookbook
2 quarts chopped cabbage
2 or 3 carrots, grated
1 sweet pepper, chopped
1 med. onion, sliced
Mix cabbage, carrots, pepper together. Sprinkle over it: 1 tsp. celery seed; 1 tsp. salt. Place sliced onions on top. Boil 1/2 cup oil, 1/2 cup vinegar and 1/2 cup sugar. Pour over vegetables and cover. Let set in refrigerator 24 hours. Remove onions. Slaw will keep several days.

1-2-3-4-5 DESSERT
(Donna McLain)
1 can crushed pineapple
1 can cherry pie filling
1 yellow cake mix
1 cup chopped nuts (optional)
1 stick butter
Butter pan and pour in one can crushed pineapple—Add cherry pie filling. Sprinkle one box cake mix (dry) over cherries and pineapple. Cut butter in small squares and lay on top. Sprinkle with nuts (if desired). Spoon around a bit but do not stir. Bake at 350 degrees until slightly brown. Serve with scoop of ice cream.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN, Pursuant to Article 21 of Chapter 143, General Statutes of North Carolina, as amended, that a public hearing will be held by the Water and Air Quality Control Committee of the North Carolina Board of Water and Air Resources for the purpose of considering the upgrading of classifications of certain waters in the Broad, Catawba, French Broad, Hiwassee, Little Tennessee, New, and Watauga River Basins. The hearing will be held in the Carmichael Humanities Building, Humanities Lecture Hall, University of North Carolina at Asheville, University Heights, Asheville, North Carolina, beginning at 10:00 a.m. E.D.T., Tuesday, March 12, 1974.

The waters to be considered for reclassification during the hearing, include certain streams or segments of streams in the named counties, situated in the following River Basins:

- 1 - Broad River Basin: Buncombe, Cleveland, Henderson, Lincoln, McDowell, Polk, and Rutherford Counties
- 2 - Catawba River Basin: Lincoln County
- 3 - French Broad River Basin: Avery, Buncombe, Haywood, Henderson, Madison, Mitchell, Transylvania and Yancey Counties
- 4 - Hiwassee River Basin: Cherokee and Clay Counties
- 5 - Little Tennessee River Basin: Graham, Jackson, Macon and Swain Counties
- 6 - New River Basin: Alleghany, Ashe and Watauga Counties
- 7 - Watauga River Basin: Avery, and Watauga Counties

All persons interested in these reclassifications are invited to attend. Persons desiring to be heard should give notice thereof in writing to the Board on or before the date of the hearing. It is requested that, insofar as possible, any person desiring to offer lengthy comments and discussions in regard to the proposed classifications, be prepared at the public hearing to submit a written statement for inclusion in the record of proceedings.
