

# WAMY Helps In Energy Crisis

W.A.M.Y. Community Action, Inc., has recently programmed funds into a special project designed to aid low-income families in coping with the energy crisis.

The Community Action
Agency, serving Watauga, Yancey, Avery, and Mitchell Counties, did not receive special
funding but felt the project was
worthy of diverting funds from
other program areas.

Many of the homes of the low-income are not construc - ted for adequately withstand - ing severe winter weather. The agency staff felt that a shortage of fuel, plus sub-standard housing could create tremendous problems for many people during periods of severely cold weather.

With limited funds, the agency cannot hope to meet all the needs. To date, Yancey County staff has assisted 29 families in the Energy Crisis Project.

Insulation, weather-strip ping, plastic sheeting for windows, caulking, lineoleum,
doors, etc., have been purchased to help winterize homes.
Volunteer and staff labor have
been utilized in installation of
the materials.

W.A.M.Y. staff urges everyone to be aware of and use the measures for conserving energy. Lowered thermostats, reduced driving speeds, and similar techniques will, if practiced by everyone, result in a tremendous aggregate saving of energy.


# On These Farewell
